EVENT: Job Search Club helps recent grads search for first career positions.

WHAT: Going to the beach won't be a top priority for 50 recent UCSD graduates during the next three weeks. Instead, each graduate will participate in the UCSD Career Services Center's Job Search Club in hopes of landing their first career positions out of college. The job hunters will practice and develop job search skills, and actively apply those skills as they contact potential employers and conduct their search. The Center's expert career advisors serve as job search coaches, providing interactive practice sessions, pep talks, and tips on dealing with issues such as job search stress and salary negotiation.

WHO: The 50 graduates are seeking work in a variety of fields including marketing, engineering, human resources, public relations, forensics, graphic design, television screenwriting, finance and public health. They graduated June 14 with bachelor's, master's or doctorate degrees in fields such as bioengineering, urban planning, visual arts, economics, cognitive science, environmental chemistry and international relations.
