NATIONAL AUTHORITY ON CULTS TO SPEAK AT UCSD MAY 20

Cult phenomenon will be discussed by Ronald Enroth, a leading scholar on cultism, at a May 20 forum sponsored by the United Campus Ministry at the University of California, San Diego.

The lecture, free and open to the public, will be held at 4 p.m. in Gallery A of the Price Center.

In his talk Enroth will address cult phenomenon as it exists in San Diego and on the UCSD campus, and religious identity versus cultism.

An acknowledged national resource on cults and new religious movements, Enroth has spent the past two decades researching and writing in the areas of current religious movements and the sociology of deviant behavior. His latest book, released earlier this spring, is entitled Churches that Abuse. His other books range from The Jesus People, published in 1972, to Evangelizing the Cults, 1990. The Garland Reference Library of Social Science has called Enroth "the single most important Evangelical Christian counter-cult writer of the 1980's."
