

Six faculty members in "Outstanding Educators of America"

Six University of California, San Diego faculty members have been chosen to appear in the 1972 edition of "Outstanding Educators of America." Nominated earlier this year, they were selected for the honor on the basis of their civic and professional achievements.

The six are: Dr. Paul Saltman, Vice Chancellor - Academic Affairs; Dr. Russell Doolittle, Associate Professor of Chemistry; Newton Harrison, Associate Professor of Visual Arts; Dr. F. Thomas Bond, Associate Professor of Chemistry; Dr. Donald A. Norman, Professor of Psychology; and Dr. George H. Szanto, Assistant Professor of German and Comparative Literature.

Outstanding Educators of America is an annual awards program honoring distinguished men and women for their exceptional service, achievements, and leadership in the field of education. Each year those selected are featured in a national awards volume, "Outstanding Educators of America."

Nominations for the program are made by officials of colleges and universities including presidents, deans, and department chairmen. Guidelines for selection include an educator's talents in the classroom, contributions to research, administrative abilities, civic service, and professional recognition.
