

John William Hooper appointed Professor of Economics

John William Hooper has been appointed Professor of Economics at the University of California, San Diego, Chancellor John S. Galbraith announced.

Professor Hooper left a teaching position at Yale University, where he had been doing research and teaching since 1959. He became an Associate Professor there in 1961.

Before joining the Yale faculty, Hooper was an Economic Researcher and Analyst for the internationally known Rand Corporation. The preceding year he studied under a Fulbright Scholarship at the Econometric Institute, Rotterdam, the Netherlands.

From 1955-1957 he served as both an acting instructor and researcher at his alma mater, Stanford University. A Haynes Foundation Scholarship supported his research.

Originally from Wisconsin, Hooper graduated in 1950 from Stanford University with an AB degree in Economics. He studied briefly at the University of Washington and the University of California, Berkeley, and then returned to Stanford to earn his Ph.D. degree, which he received in 1961.

Professor Hooper claims membership in the American Economic Association, the American Statistical Association and the Econometric Society.

His honors include Phi Beta Kappa, awarded to him in 1950, a Senior Fellowship from the Social Science Research Council, given to him for the year 1964-1965, and a Fulbright Scholarship.

Professor Hooper and his wife, Eva, have moved from Hamden, Connecticut to a La Jolla home, where they will reside while Professor Hooper is with the University.
