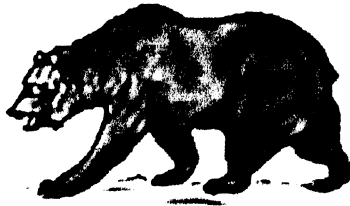

# President's Message

I was back from China in time to attend our October Fall Brunch which was ably planned by our dynamic Vice Presidential team of Margaret Acampora, Judy Skelton, and Mary Dashen. In my estimation, the brunch was flawless. The highlight of this occasion, as usual, was greeting each other after our summer hiatus and talking about what is going to happen within Oceanids this coming year.

Announcements are already out about our December Holiday party chaired by Mary Mcillwain and Maxine Bloor. I heard rumors that the Klezmer Band, Christmas Caroling and Bagpipes will all be back to help us celebrate this festive season with food, music and dance. Then in February, we will be holding our 2nd Annual Fundraising Theatre Party. Watch for more about Shakespeare's „Measure for Measure.“ Both events were fun-laden last year, I expect the same this year.

We have already had two „Sounding Board“ lectures held at the Faculty Club. This last month there was a bit of family „arm twisting“ and we heard Molli Wagner's husband, Arthur, take us on a tour of theatre in New York, London, San Francisco and last but not least, he talked about our own San Diego. Kudos for UCSD Theatre Department and the La Jolla Playhouse along with the other San Diego equity theatres. It seems we are one of the most successful "off-off" Broadway venues with an exceptional local audience with experimental or sophisticated taste in theatre.

Now, for you who have been asking me what I did in China. I'll tell you about some highlights. The ancient capital of Xian, with its terracotta warriors, was the destination for Marco Polo's travels and the starting point for our exploration of the "Silk Road". From there we flew to Dunhuang where I guiltily thought of the Oceanid Board while wandering through the Magao Caves looking at the famous painted murals from the 3rd century onward to the Han Dynasty. Surrounding Dunhuang are the sand dunes of the Gobi desert. I rode a camel among the dunes which made me think about more of Marco Polo's adventures. From there we took a night train to the desert oasis town of Turpan. At the local bazaar, I acquired a 12 year old Uighur pen pal, jounced around on a donkey cart to see Jiaoke, an ancient desert city and ate sultana grapes. On motor coach, we arrived in Urumchi. In Urumchi I danced with a Kazakh night club singer, went to a mountain lake in the Tien Shan mountains and saw a mountain Kazakh village of yurts. The tour also took us to Beijing and Shanghai. The Yangtze River cruise was a relaxing interlude in an otherwise exhausting trip.

I have to say, China was also a shopping adventure. What made it fun was "I could buy off the rack." You will see me donning my new garments and jewelry at various Oceanid functions. The highlight of shopping was being

fitted for a bright red "Quipao" at 11am in Wuhan and having it delivered to the Yangtze River boat just before the ship was ready to sail. In the meantime, I had run into a shoe shop and picked up a pair of glittery party shoes. All this for celebrating China's National Day while aboard ship.

I still plan to write an article about my impressions, but that will have to wait for later.

## How I became a legend without knowing it.

After I had been held prisoner in the Nazi concentration camp Terezin (Theresienstadt) (Czech Republic) for three years, the Second World War was finally over. On May 12th 1945 I was heading with a friend to Prague with very vague plans for our future life. Hilda Stein was a friend with whom I had shared a bunkbed during our years in Terezin. We arrived on a Red Army field kitchen truck and the streets of Prague still showed signs of recent fighting. That did not interfere with our dreams of how our old friends would welcome us and help us. But nothing like that happened. Our old "friends" had their own worries and did not welcome us or help us find shelter. We became homeless, sleeping on the railroad station benches, covered with newspapers. But here we learned from a former fellow prisoner that in the Old Square there was a housing distribution office where we could get an apartment abandoned by the Germans. When we got there, the line was endless and Hilda and I decided to take turns every two hours. In the long line we met familiar faces, people who welcomed everybody who survived and we learned about the fate of those less fortunate. Time passed quickly and at one point Hilda did not show up for her turn. She came much later with a fresh permanent! I was neither amused nor understanding. We got an apartment, and it was the one in which I lived with my mother before the war. My mother and I, being Jewish, were evicted from this apartment in the fall of 1939, and a German family moved in. Now six years later, this family had left for Germany in a big hurry with some essential belongings only, and Hilda and I got this apartment with almost everything we needed. Bedding, pots and pans, dishes, even some towels were there. On May 16 we were ready to start our new life.

Hilda got herself a job as a secretary. My first trip was to the high school from which I had been expelled for being a Jew in 1940. I inquired about re-enrolling and finishing my basic education. My eventual goal was to become a physician. The principal, who knew me and even taught me before the war, was visibly pleased to see me back. She gave me the warmest welcome that I ever got. She was determined to be helpful. Her suggested plan was to enroll in a "war senior class" created for students who were expelled for various reasons and had to interrupt their schooling. This class was planned as a summer session starting May 20, and ending in the middle of August. If all went well she said, I could then enroll in Medical School in the fall, or if not, I could repeat the class the following academic year and have my plans delayed by one year.

May 20, 1945 two weeks after the Second World War ended and 8 days after arriving in Prague without a home or money, I was sitting in the classroom. This sounds simple, but it was one of the hardest times in my life. First of all, I had the largest gap in schooling of all my classmates. It was not a gap, it was a ravine. Then, I had trouble concentrating for long times in order to study. After one hour of study I became so sleepy that I had to sleep for an hour and that ended up being my working pattern. I studied almost day and night and lost my circadian rhythm. On top of it, I still had nightmares and seldom had a good night's sleep even when I found the time to sleep. Then came the problem with digestion. For the first three months my diet consisted of bread and water. That was my choice because I tolerated it well and I found the bread delicious and the water exceptionally tasty. The bread had no mold and the water was so clear and fresh. But after a regular meal I was ill. Finally, I had a psychological problem with school. Just three weeks before school started, my greatest concern had been how to survive until the next day, and now it was hard to comprehend why my concern should be the fall of ancient Sparta. Initially all subjects sounded totally trivial and irrelevant to me. It was a big struggle against many odds. Never before or after did I work so hard. Somehow though, I managed and got through. I ran into some problems with the Latin teacher and had to take a remedial exam. My final report card did not look so great. But I had passed.

In September 1945 I enrolled in Medical School. By that time I was quite adjusted to my new life and did not feel as different from my classmates as I had before.

Later, I learned that at this time I had become a legend among my contemporaries, the returnees from concentration camps. Parents were using me as an example to their children. I was admired for going back to school so soon on my own and for the fact that I normalized my life not looking back for a moment.

My status as a legend did not last very long. By the time I found out about it, it was already over.
