

UCSD Medical School To Offer Course in Genetics Jan. 20-24, 1964

A short course in genetics for Medical School Faculty will be offered by the University of California, San Diego, in La Jolla, California, from January 20 through 24, 1964.

The course will be open to Medical School Faculty members with an interest in genetics. The instructional staff consists of D. M. Bonner, B. Childs, J. Crow, J. A. DeMoss, C. L. Markert, V. A. McKusick, R. D. Owen, H. Roman, O. Smithies, G. Stent, W. J. Young, and C. Yanofsky.

Topics to be covered are the chemical nature of genes, genetic analysis, mutation, quantitative control of protein synthesis, human biochemical genetics, immunogenetics, cytogenetics, and population genetics.

Supported by a grant from the National Institutes of Health, the course is the second of its type to be offered by the Biology Department of UCSD. Its object is to review recent advances in basic genetics for Medical School Faculty members with an interest in human genetics.

Enrollment is limited to 40 persons. No registration fee will be required. Assistance will be offered in locating suitable accommodations near the campus. Applications should include a brief curriculum vitae and a statement of background in genetics (if any).

Applications must be received by November 20. They will be acted on by December 10. Applications and requests for further information should be addressed to:
