

Lecture series, "Adventures in Research" continues with Bud Smithey's lecture on "Deep Ocean Hot Springs: An Oasis of Life"

Bud Smithey, a researcher at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, will provide a fascinating look at some recent discoveries on the ocean floor when he discusses "Deep Ocean Hot Springs: An Oasis of Life" in the next "Adventures in Research" lecture at the University of California, San Diego.

The illustrated talk will be given at noon Wednesday, Feb. 11, in Conference Room 111A of the Administrative Complex. The public is invited and admission is free.

Smithey will provide his audience with a look at an apparently unique collection of deep sea animals which have been found living at the edge of the hot springs surrounded by near-freezing water.

His lecture is part of the ongoing series titled "Adventures in Research" which features members of the UC San Diego faculty discussing their fields of study.

The series is sponsored by the Council of Provosts, the Public Information Office and Third College.

The winter quarter series will conclude on Wednesday, Feb. 25, with a talk by former UC San Diego Chancellor Herbert York who will discuss his experiences negotiating with the Russians as head of the American delegation to the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty.

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
