

Speakers' Bureau new brochure

A selection of 36 categories ranging from Africa and anthropology to nuclear energy and stress management is being offered during the 1984-85 academic year by the Speakers' Bureau at the University of California, San Diego.

A new brochure listing the main categories and over 90 speakers and 150 individual topics has just been issued by the UCSD Public Information Office and is available to clubs and organizations throughout the San Diego area. The brochure may be requested from the Public Information Office, Q-036, UCSD, La Jolla, California 92093 or by calling 452-3120.

There is no charge for speakers. Anyone requesting a program should allow two to three weeks lead time for scheduling a speaker.

The UCSD Speakers' Bureau supplied programs for 53 meetings in city and county schools and for public and private groups during the past year. Among the more popular categories were astronomy with topics like "Meteorites: Strange Visitors from Outer Space" and "The Origins and Evolution of the Solar System" and physical fitness and stress management with topics like "Middle Age Begins at 24," "Physical Fitness for Execs" and "How to Handle and Manage Stress."

Categories covering computers and energy offer up to the minute topics on "Computer Applications," "Thermonuclear Fusion" and "The Shape of Things to Come." On the other hand, the history category offers such topics as "Civil War," "Slavery and the South" and "American Radicalism." The student affairs category offers practical topics such as "Applying for Financial aid" and "Science Career Options."

In addition to the categories and topics listed in the brochure, the Public Information Office can often locate qualified speakers on specific topics for special requests.
