

Fort George May 5th 1722

Gentlemen

My regiments both move and coming
up, and I am so distressed for Battalions
that I shall not be able to expedite them
into Canada so soon as I would wish, &
unless I save every Battalion I possibly
can you will therefore not take one
boat more than what is barely necessary
to transport your respective Companies
thirty men might go in a Battalion
you will also please to take no more
than nine Cars to each boat, pray
give strict orders to the proper Officers
to see these observed.
