

Theodore W. Forbes will discuss the growth of the San Diego campus in the field of enrollment and student affairs

How the San Diego campus of the University of California is growing, particularly in the field on enrollment and student affairs, will be discussed by the recently-appointed Dean of Student Affairs Theodore W. Forbes, at a forthcoming meeting in Pacific Beach.

Forbes will speak before the Pacific Beach Kiwanis Club at noon Thursday, October 18, at the Catamaran Hotel.

Dean Forbes will touch on enrollment growth and accommodations for students. "In making study space for our graduate students, men who are working for the Ph.D., we have had to put 28 of them into a beach cottage originally built in 1915 at a cost of \$1,000," he says. "The building contains 968 square feet of usable space, just barely room enough for desks for each of them." Completion of the new building of the School of Science and Engineering on Torrey Pines Mesa in the spring will alleviate the situation, but not cure it, he says. "The continued growth of student body depends on the building program, and that depends a great deal on how Proposition 1-A fares in November," Forbes says.

Formerly Director of Physical Education and Recreation for President Kennedy's Council on Youth Fitness, Forbes joined San Diego staff in July.
