

A. Quincy Jones, F.A.I.A., appointed consulting architect for the University of California, San Diego

The appointment of A. Quincy Jones, F.A.I.A., as consulting architect for the University of California, San Diego, was announced here today by Chancellor John S. Galbraith.

A partner in the Los Angeles architectural firm of Jones and Emmons, he has designed a variety of buildings for the University of Southern California, University of Hawaii, and University of California campuses at Los Angeles, Santa Barbara, Riverside, and Irvine. Jones is master planner for Palos Verdes State College.

He has been president of the Southern California Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, and has been a visiting professor at USC for fourteen years. He received his degree in architecture from the University of Washington. Jones was designated a Fellow of the AIA for excellence in design.
