

Members of faculty at UCSD chosen as All-University Lecturers

Five members of the faculty of the University of California, San Diego, have been chosen as All-University Faculty Lecturers, one of the highest distinctions in the University system.

Under the University's plan for intercampus cultural exchange, faculty members of one campus are requested to present special lectures at other campuses.

The men chosen from San Diego are David M. Bonner, Professor of Biology, George Feher, Professor of Physics, Walter H. Munk, Professor of Physics, Per F. Scholander, Professor of Physiology, and Harold C. Urey, Professor of Chemistry-at-Large.

Bonner and Feher are to speak at Berkeley, Scholander at Davis, Urey at Los Angeles, and Munk at Riverside. The appointments were announced by President Clark Kerr recently.

The San Diego campus shares in the All-University Faculty Lecture Series by visits of distinguished lecturers from other campuses. Roger Y. Stanier, Professor of Microbiology, Berkeley, presented one of the lectures on the San Diego campus in January. Others scheduled are Jack F. Evernden, Professor of Geology, Berkeley, Richard E. Powell, Professor of Chemistry, Berkeley, and Garrett Hardin, Professor of Biology, Santa Barbara.

Dates for the appearances of the San Diegans on other campuses have not been arranged.
