Jeffrey Rosen, legal affairs editor of The New Republic, will speak on The End of Privacy at 7 p.m. May 26 at the University of California, San Diego. The event is free and open to the public.

Rosen, also an adjunct associate professor at the George Washington University Law School, is serving as a Regents' Lecturer in UCSD's Department of History May 25-29.

Rosen received a bachelor's degree in English and government from Harvard, a bachelor's degree in philosophy, politics and economics from Oxford University and a law degree from Yale Law School.

In addition to his work for The New Republic, he has published in The New Yorker, The New York Times Magazine, The Atlantic Monthly, Constitutional Commentary, and the Yale Law Journal.
