

Penner to edit new journal "Energy"

January 15, 1976

An international scholarly journal addressing the challenging issues of energy technology and policy will make its debut early this year.

According to Professor Stanford S. Penner, director of the University of California, San Diego Energy Center and editor of the new journal, called simply Energy, the contents of the publication have a consciousness-raising goal.

Authors of articles will be asked to meet exacting requirements to clarify and document their findings for the edification of readers with a wide variety of specialties.

"We ask the indulgence of our readers," says Penner, "when they are confronted by topical contributions that represent significant advances in esoteric fields of which they will appreciate the importance without necessarily understanding all of the intermediate analyses.

"It is our hope and expectation that this publication will prove to be an important factor in raising the standards of discussions, analyses and evaluation relating to energy programs."

Among the associate editors to be listed on the masthead are nuclear physicist Edward Teller, associate director at large and for physics of UC Lawrence Livermore Laboratory; UC San Diego Chancellor William D. McElroy and A. K. Oppenheim, professor of mechanical engineering, UC Berkeley.

Teller, Hannes Alfvén and Harold C. Urey will contribute manuscripts in the first issue of Energy to a "Testimony and Dialogue Relating to the California Nuclear Initiative."

Penner's succinct summary of the reasons for starting a Journal in this era of high mortality for publications: "It's needed."
