

## The Mediterranean Arts Chorale will perform in Sherwood Hall on Oct. 22.

The Mediterranean Arts Chorale from the Los Angeles campus of the University of California will perform in Sherwood Hall, La Jolla at 8:30 p.m. Friday, October 22 under the joint sponsorship of the University's Intercampus Cultural Exchange Committee and the Committee for Arts and Lectures from the San Diego campus.

Tickets are 50 cents each and will be sold at the door only.

The Mediterranean Arts Chorale, made up of thirty-five singers and dancers, was established in the fall of 1964 by UCLA students who joined together to sing the music of Bonia Shur and other Israeli composers. The students have become so intrigued with the unique sounds of the Holy Land that they have formed into a permanent artistic body to study and perform music from the entire Mediterranean area.

The director of the Chorale, Bonia Shur, is an Israeli composer; now studying at UCLA for his doctorate in composition. Many of the works on the program are either his own original compositions or are traditional tunes arranged by him.

Since its formation, the Chorale has appeared in numerous concerts and on television. The future plans of the Chorale include concerts in California and other western states, a long play recording with one of the leading a nationwide companies, and a possible sponsored concert-tour to Spain and Israel next summer.

The La Jolla program of the Chorale will feature a choreographic work by Fanchon Wechsler performed by graduate students of the UCLA dance department. The work combines live chorale music, poetry, and dance into a unified human statement.
