

Parapsychological medicine, faith healing to be explored by Faces of Healing lecture

Parapsychological medicine, faith healing, witch doctors and the laying on of hands will be explored in the fourth of a seven-part lecture series, "Faces of Healing," Tuesday, May 10, at the University of California, San Diego.

The session, free and open to the public, will begin at noon in Building C of the Student Center and will feature presentations by Alan A. Frischer, an undergraduate biology and economics major at UC San Diego, and Robert D. Mootz, a former UC San Diego student currently studying at the Palmer College of Chiropractic in Davenport, Iowa.

Frischer, who is planning to do graduate study in public health at Yale University, has done extensive research in the community examining parapsychological phenomena and healing.

Mootz has also been involved with various applications of parapsychology and its relationship to medicine and healing, and has focused his interests on holistic and preventive medicine.

Following the May 10 presentation, the remaining lectures in the series, May 17, 24 and 31, will cover such topics as biofeedback, meditation, visualization, nutrition, stress reduction and dynamic correlations between healing institutions and techniques.
