EXTERNAL AFFAIRS COMMISSION BYLAWS

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO

I. Name

The name of the body established by these bylaws shall be the External Affairs Commission of the University of California, San Diego.

II. Function of the External Affairs Commission

- A. The External Affairs Commission is hereby established by the Associated Students as an Advisory Commission to the Associated Students on issues concerning the quality of student life.
 - 1. Issues considered by the External Affairs Commission include, but are not limited to: registration fee programming, community services, student housing, financial aid, student employment, transportation, utilities, student affirmative action, and student participation in the collective bargaining process.
 - 2. The External Affairs Commission shall provide reports to Council.
 - 3. The External Chair of the Affairs Commission shall introduce resolutions in Associated Students Council supporting or opposing any issues that reflect student concerns.
 - 4. The External Affairs Commission shall perform additional duties as assigned by the Council.

III. Responsibilities of the Commission Chair A. The Commission chair shall:

- 1. be the Associated Students External Affairs Vice President.
- 2. chair the respective commission as a non-voting member except in the case of a tie.
- 3. submit to the council Administrative Vice-President the minutes of each commission meeting.
- 4. perform additional duties assigned by the council.

IV. Responsibilities of the Commission Vice-Chair

- A. 1. The Commission Vice-Chair shall in the temporary absence of the Commission Chair, assume all the powers and responsibilities of the Commission Chair. The powers and responsibilities does not include those of the Vice-President of External Affairs.
 - 2. record and submit to the Commission Chair the minutes of each Commission meeting.
 - 3. perform any additional duties assigned by the Commission and approved by a majority of the Council.
 - 4. shall be elected by a majority vote of the Commission and approved by a majority of the Council.

V. Meeting Procedures

- A. 1. The Commission shall meet once per week at a time to be designated. Special meetings may be called by the Commission Chair, the Associated Student President, or the Associated Student Council as deemed necessary.
 - 2. Agenda materials shall be distributed to all Commission members (and shall be made available to Associated Students upon request) at least one (1) day prior to the regular meeting.
 - 3. Agenda items shall be submitted to the Commission chair at least three (3) days prior to the regular meeting.
 - 4. Approval of the agenda will be the first item of business of each meeting.
 - 5. All motions must follow the order of the agenda. Any exceptions to the order of the agenda shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote approval of a Special Order of Business.
 - 6. Approval of minutes shall be a regular order of business at each meeting.

VI. Commission Membership and Voting Procedures

- 1. The undergraduate members of the Commission shall consist of:
 - a. the ASUCSD External Affairs Vice President
 - b. the SBPC representative
 - c. the ASUCSD Lobby Annex Director
 - d. the Assistant Lobby Annex Director for State Affairs
 - e. the Assistant Lobby Annex Director for Municipal Affairs
 - f. the Assistant Lobby Annex Director for Federal Affairs
 - g. the ASUCSD Collective Bargaining Representative
 - h. one Senator from each college

- i. two students-at-large
- 2. Additional representatives may be appointed by a 2/3 vote of council.
- 3. Any revision of these bylaws must be approved by a 2/3 vote of council.
- 4. Each standing member, except the Commission Chair, shall cast one vote. The chair shall call and preside at meetings of the commission and shall vote only in the event of a tie.
- 5. The two student-at-large members shall be selected through an open application process to be administered by the Vice President of External Affairs.
- 6. In the event that a recommendation is submitted to council, all votes by the commission for, against, and abstaining opinion from the recommendation must be submitted to the council with the recommendation itself.
- 7. Members of the commission who wish to express their opinion (before the council) must do so in writing. Dissenting views must be submitted to the A.S. Vice President Administrative prior to the A.S. Council agenda deadline.

Due to overwhelming UCSD student, faculty, and staff support for Aurora Evora's flower business (support being expressed by more than two thousand signatures on a petition to keep Aurora Evora's flower service on the UCSD campus).

THE RESPECTIVE SITUATIONS OF THE PARTIES Hereto as Follows:

Aurora Evora's flower business, located on UCSD campus will become an ASUCSD enterprise, in accordance with UCSD and ASUCSD policies. Whereof, said Parties, by reason of the aforesaid situations AND BY THEIR MUTUAL AGREEMENT hereinafter contained, do hereby stipulate and agree as follows:

- 1. Aurora Evora agrees to provide service from 9am to 5pm five days a week (except for extenuating circumstances), during the academic year.
- 2. Term shall be from the date executed through June 14, 1986 at which point this contract may be renewed with the mutual consent of both parties.
- 3. As an ASUCSD enterprise, Aurora Evora's flower business will pay 15% of its net income to the ASUCSD.
- 4. A monthly income statement accompanied by payment of 15% of monthly net income will be given to the A.S. Business Office by the fifth working day of every month.
- 5. Aurora Evora is an independent contractor and is not acting as an employee of UCSD or the Regents and shall make no representations which may indicate a guarantee by UCSD or the Regents of the goods sold.

- 6. Aurora Evora shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Regents, its officers, employees, and agents from and against any losses and expenses, claims, suits, or other liability including product liability, resulting from injury to any person or damage to property arising out of or in any way connected with the seller's exercise of the Agreement, provided such injuries to persons or damage to property are due to the acts or omission of seller, its officers, employees or agents, or the products manufactured or sold by them.
- 7. This agreement may be terminated with thrity days (30) af advanced written notification of either party.
- 8. Notice shall be deemed to have been given in writing when delivered in person to the parties designated below.

VII. Media Funding Guidelines

- A. All media shall be funded up to a level of \$4000.00, beginning with the year 1986-87. Subsequent funding shall be adjusted by the California price index, using the previous year's allocation as the baseline allocation.
- B. This allocation shall cover production costs of six (6) issues during the course of the year (2 each quarter), as well as production costs associated with running a newspaper.
- C. Cost shall reflect usage of newsprint paper; black ink only; 10 halftones per issue; 12 page issues and delivery.
- D. Color, special projects, and special formating shall be paid for by income obtained by individual medias.
- E. Each media will be responsible for providing a publication schedule at the beginning of each quarter.
- F. Each media is free to extend and/or expand their publications within the rules as provided by the Media Charter, with funding coming from internal sources, such as advertising revenues.
- G. Non-compliance with any of the above articles shall result in the review of the particular media by the Media Board, and can ultimately cause the freezing or reallocation of the particular budget.

VIII. New Medias

- A. Prospective new medias shall, upon review by the Media Board, be funded up to \$2,500.00 the first year. This is to cover costs for one (1) issue per quarter for three (3) quarters.
- B. In-statement of a new media to full funding shall be possible in their second full year of existence, and shall come under review of the Media Board.
- C. All medias, and their policies, shall come into quarterly review by the Media Board. Failure to comply with existing bylaws can result in freezing and/or reallocation of a media's budget.

IX. Existing Medias

- A. Existing medias have the option to publish less than six (6) times a year. Funding, as reviewed by the Media Board, shall reflect this.
- B. Media presently receiving funding in excess of \$4000.00 shall, over a period of 3 years, have this excess reallocated to Media Unallocated. This process shall take place in 3 equal installment payments.
- C. The reverse process shall be used to bring up the desired level all medias receiving funding below \$4000.00
- D. This policy shall come into effect starting with the 1986-1987 budget, so that an equality level will be in operation by 1988-1989.

ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO, HEREIN AFTER CALLED THE ASUCSD, AS REPRESENTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS.

THE CRAFT CENTER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO, HEREIN AFTER CALLED THE UCSD CRAFT CENTER, AS REPRESENTED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CRAFT CENTER.

THE RESPECTIVE SITUATIONS OF THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

THE ASUCSD AND THE UCSD CRAFT CENTER ARE BOTH INVOLVED AND RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CREATION AND OPERATION OF A NEW CAFE, (WHICH WILL BE REFERRED TO AS THE A.S. CAFE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE CONTRACT) ON THE CAMPUS OF UCSD. THIS CAFE WILL BE LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE UCSD CRAFT CENTER.

WHEREOF, SAID PARTIES, BY REASON OF THE AFORESAID SITUATIONS AND BY THEIR MUTUAL AGREEMENT HEREINAFTER CONTAINED, DO HEREBY STIPULATE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The ASUCSD and the UCSD Craft Center will share the A.S. Cafe profits and losses equally.
 - A) "Profits" are defined as that amount of money existing after all costs related to the A.S. Cafe are adhered to (monthly operating, amortization out and mandated reserve account contribution) after fiscal closing.
 - B) "Losses" are defined as that amount of money that the A.S. Cafe is in deficit after fiscal closing.
- 2. All fiscal operation of the A.S. Cafe will be overseen by the ASUCSD Business Office.
- 3. All physical plant/maintenance operations of the A.S. Cafe will be overseen by the UCSD Craft Center.
- 4. A committee will be established composed of seven (7) voting individuals, three (3) from the ASUCSD and three (3) from the UCSD Craft Center. There will also be one (1) The A.S. Business Office. The Committee will meet on the first tuesday of each month and on any other dates desired necessary by committee members or the general manager. No committee member can be an employee of the A.S. Cafe. The committee positions will be held by the following people:

- 7. The priority of organizations to book events at the A.S. Cafe is as follows:
 - 1) UCSD Craft Center
 - 2) Cafe' Committee

- 8. Revision of this contract can only occur with majority approval of the A.S. Cafe committee, and by majority vote of quorum of the ASUCSD Council.

CHARTER OF EMPLOYMENT EXPECTATIONS

AND OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR

THE A.S. CAFE

MARCH 11, 1986

Introduction

The following is a ten fold document which specifically outlines the operating procedure and philosophy of the A.S. Cafe. The job expectations and operating procedures outlines in this contract are complete and concise. Those employed to operate the A.S. Cafe are responsible to adhere to those specifications outlined in this document.

I. Philosophy

The Cafe is to maintain a forum that opens social and academic channels within the UCSD community.

The Cafe is an A.S. enterprise representing the welfare of the general student body. The basic premise is to create an environment such that those that enter it feel uninhibited to work on those ideas and changes they find important. The Cafe is to act as a catalyst, lowering the resistance in the environment so that interaction can occur more freely.

UCSD should not become a theoretical trade school where people are simply programmed with marketable skills but rather it must be maintained as a place where one can learn to think. All disciplines teach one to think in a specific way. Each presents a different way of seeing the world, an approach to tackle more difficult problems and to see the beauty in what is about them. It is this activity of bringing these people together that will put UCSD on the forefront, the cutting edge; it is this activity that the Cafe should support.

The Cafe must be a practical group who will make concessions so as to bring their ideas into actuality. But let it be noted that the Cafe is build on a theoretical groundwork, a set of ideas. Concessions the Cafe should not make are those that would impinge on the atmosphere. Such a sacrifice would destroy the main purpose of the Cafe and is likely to lead to its failure. The Cafe is not a building but an environment.

The Cafe will also be a nice place to sit.

II Cafe Committee

100

The Cafe committee is that body composed of the following seven individuals:

- A) Voting Members
 - 1) Craft Center Director
 - 2) Craft Center Administrative Assistant
 - 3) Craft Center Student Employee (must not be an employee of the A.S. Cafe-selected by the governing body of the Craft Center)
 - 4) Director of Student Activities
 - 5) Commissioner of Operations and Services
 - 6) Vice President Finance
 - 7) A.S. Business Office Manager

The Committee is responsible for the following:

- A) Hiring of Student Managers
- B) Overseeing the hiring of students as A.S. Cafe employees
- C) Establishment and changes of the menu and items to be sold
- D) Establishment and operation of price structure
- E) Establishing the hours of operation
- F) Amending and appending this document
- G) Overseeing the scheduling of events and Cafe related programs for the A.S. Cafe
- H) Weekly meetings or as deemed necessary by the ASUCSD or the UCSD Craft Center or the A.S. Cafe committee or the General Manager
- Establish and monitor operational and cleanliness standards

All members of the Cafe committee have open access to the Cafe and its employees for the purpose of inquiry, but any action except that through the General Manager or the Cafe Committee is prohibited. Members of the Cafe Committee are prohibited from being A.S. Cafe employees concurrently.

III Personnel

The A.S. Cafe as an adjunct to the University of California, in compliance with Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (45 CFR 86), and Section 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or handicap in any of its policies, procedures, or practices; nor does the University, in compliance with the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 and Section 402 of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act of 1974, discriminate against any employees or applicants for employment on the basis of their age or because they are disabled veterans or veterans of the Vietnam Era.

The employees of the A.S. Cafe must fulfill the following criteria:

Employees of the A.S. Cafe must be enrolled fee paying UCSD undergrad or graduate student with at least 8 units.

The A.S. Cafe will be staffed by one General Manager, two assistant managers and an open ended number of employees and volunteers.

A) Duties Summary

General Manager
 The general manager is that person responsible for maintaining
 and operating the A.S. Cafe to those specifications outlined in
 this document. If there is any deviation from these

specifications the general manager must move to correct the situation or be held responsible.

Specific Duties:

- a) Submit an annual report at the end of each fiscal year documenting revenue, profit, costs and projected growth.
- b) Organize Cafe Personnel
- c) Organize advertising
- d) Determine stock demands and make purchases from a variety of vendors. Responsible for receiving orders and insuring correctness.
- e) Bookkeeping duties; pay bills.
- f) Work closely with the A.S. Business Office insuring policy and procedures are adhered to.
- g) Working the register and serving customers.

2) Assistant Managers

There are to be two assistant managers who are to work under the direction of the general manager.

- a) Recruit volunteers; provide work direction.
- b) Organize orientation and training program.
- c) Partial purchasing responsibility; including inventory control.
- d) Working the register and serving customers.

3) Paid Employees

The employees are to work under the direction of the managers.

- a) Working the register and serving customers.
- 4) Volunteers

The volunteers are to work under the direction of the managers.

a) Serving Customers.

B) Selection Process

1) Management

The General Manager and two Assistant Managers are to be picked at the end of Spring quarter to manage the summer months and the proceeding academic year. The selection will be made by the Cafe Committee and the current General Manager by concensus vote.

The applications are to be submitted to the Associated Student Body Secretary, to be forwarded to the Cafe Committee, by the first day of June. The selection is to be made before the end of the tenth week of the spring quarter.

2) Employees

The employees are to be hired and fired by the General Manager with majority approval of the Cafe Committee. If the applicant is not approved by the Cafe Committee to be an employee the committee must hand down a written explanation as to why the applicant is not suitable.

3) Volunteers

Volunteers are to be picked by the General Manager. Upon request the Cafe Committee may obtain a current list of A.S. Cafe Volunteers.

C) Pay Scale

The Management and employees will be paid by those practices adopted by the University of California at San Diego in compliance with state and federal law.

IV Daily Duties

- A) The Cafe is to be unlocked by a Manager in enough time prior to opening for business to complete the following tasks:
 - 1) Prepare equipment for service
 - 2) Sweep and wash down the deck until clean
 - 3) Unlock, wash and distribute the furniture
 - 4) Clean interior and exterior of the service shed
 - 5) Open the register (From this point on the register will never be left unattended until closing)
- B) Enter into the log book any comments about the condition or operation of the Cafe. (see section IX)
- C) Personnel are not to leave their shift until a replacement shows or by consent of one of the managers. Personnel shall not be required to work for more than ten (10) minutes past their assigned shifts. The manager shall be responsible for reporting each and every incident of absent replacements or replacements more than 10 minutes late, to the A.S. Cafe Committee.
- D) All machines are to be disassembled washed and reassembled before the end of each operating day.
- E) All exposed surfaces including tables, counters, floors and equipment are to be kept clean at all times.
- F) The cash register is to be rung out at the end of each fiscal day, and the cash receipts are to be delivered to Josie, the A.S. Business Office Manager, as outlined is section VIII.
- G) The trash is to be emptied periodically through the day and absolutely before closing. The cans are to be lined with plastic bags.

H) At closing; all lights and equipment are to be turned off and the facility is to be locked up by one of the managers.

V Advertising

- A) The cafe will be called "The A.S. Cafe."
- B) All university posting requirements will be followed.

VIII Revisions



- 2) Record of Cash Receipts
- 3) Record of any problems that arise
- 4) Supply ordering. Including cost, date ordered, inventory existing, number ordered, vendor, delivery date.
- 5) Listing of all deliveries.
- 6) Each entry shall be signed and include the time and date.

The Associated Students, UCSD, on behalf of the UCSD Cooperatives and Enterprises, Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic, and the entire student body, are pursuing the development of Alternative Housing on this campus. For a variety of reasons, elaborated below, we feel that Alternative Housing will benefit the entire University Community by providing a unique and educational housing option to the students. In order to maximize these benefits, we believe that Alternative Housing must be built on University property.

In an effort to facilitate the development process, we are calling for an officially recognized Building Advisory Committee consisting of faculty, students, staff, and administration.

The Committee should have one representative from the following:

- 1. Associated Students
- 2. Campus Planning Office
- 3. Chancellor's Office
- 4. Coops and Enterprises
- 5. Council of Deans Representative
- 6. Design and Construction
- 7. Food & Housing Services
- 8. Interfraternity Council
- 9. Panhellenic Council
- 10. Student Activities Director
- 11. Student-At-Large
- 12. International Student Representative
- 13. Undergraduate Affairs Office
- 14. Graduate Student Association

Committee Charge:

To research existing alternative housing programs and facilities at other institutions of higher education; to evaluate and develop a comprehensive plan and feasibility study for the establishment of Alternative Housing on Campus.

UCSD CURRENT HOUSING SITUATION

Additional Housing is needed on the University of California San Diego Campus for the following reasons:

1) High Enrollment

Total enrollment at UCSD is close to 15,000 (12,000 undergraduate and 2,900 graduates) as of 1985-1986, and is projected to increase to 22,125 by 2000-01. The UCSD enrollment plan projects that new undergraduates will grow by approximately 100 a year, from the Fall 1985 total of 3,179 to 4,700 by Fall 2000.

2) Increased Retention

Recent undergraduate enrollment studies have shown a higher proportion of returning students coupled with longer pregraduation enrollment. These factors contribute to increased enrollment.

3) Decrease in Available Rental Housing

Housing construction in the City of San Diego, as measured by building permits, exceeded 12,000 units in 1977 and 1978 but dropped to below 5,500 from 1980 through 1982. Furthermore, because of the desirability of University proximal housing, rental rates have increased substantially. Vacancy rates for off-campus housing facilities also have dropped from 4.9% in 1980 to 2.1% presently (within a 20 minute commute). For available and affordable housing, students are having to search further south toward the older and less expensive units. This movement will create competition for housing between UCSD and San Diego State Students. Clearly, SDSU students have an advantage because they start school three weeks earlier.

4) UCSD Student Need:

As illustrated by a survey of approximately 1100 undergraduate and graduate students, there is strong support by the entire student body for each type of alternate housing. Cooperative and International housing tallied 83% and 74% support respectively. In fact, 59% of the students polled stated that they would live in cooperative housing if it were available. Greek housing was supported by 68% of the students polled.

5) New Policy

Starting Fall 1987, all new incoming students will be assured housing on-campus for two consecutive years. This policy will require significant additional housing spaces for this segment of the student population, thus reducing available housing for upper classmen. Currently, incoming and second year students account for 40% of available housing spaces. Even after the construction and implementation of 1000 new bed spaces in 1988, this sector will have a projected demand greater than the available housing at that time. A significant proportion of this excessive housing demand will be alleviated in Fall of 1988 with the construction of 1000 new spaces. Yet

this much needed addition does not completely ameliorate the situation. In fact, according to the Project Planning Guide No. 961570, 763 spaces still will be in demand after the completion of the aforementioned housing project.

BENEFITS OF ALTERNATIVE HOUSING

1) Cohesive Organizations

On campus alternative housing creates more cohesive groups. An organization in which the members work together closely creates this cohesiveness. Alternative Housing would provide further identity for each individual organization.

2) Creates Social Center on Campus

Currently, due to the 4 college system and separated college housing units, there is no social center on campus. In 1988, the proposed University Center will be completed. This will provide a diurnal social center yet will fail to provide a social living center. Alternative housing would create this much needed social living center on campus.

3) Increase Enrollment Attractivity

Due to the increased housing demand, incoming students, freshmen and transfers alike, are aware that they may not be able to live on-campus for more than 2 years. Alternative housing will allow upperclassmen to remain on-campus in a different living environment.

4) Increase in Alumni Contributions to UCSD

It has long been documented that those alumni who give to college fund raising campaigns are those who were involved as students and felt that they received the most from their college experience. Those graduates most charitable were those involved with campus organizations and activities during their undergraduate years. Therefore, it behooves the University to promote the growth of the fraternity and cooperative system by the creation of Alternative Housing, which could result in an increase in alumni financial support.

5) Create Diversity

Alternative Housing provides more diversity to the University. Students will have an added option (in addition to dorms or apartments) for a living situation.

ALTERNATIVE HOUSING AT COMPARABLE INSTITUTIONS

Similiar projects have been recently established at several Universities throughout the country. Examples of this type of construction follow:

1) University of Pittsburgh

In 1982, a campaign for a tax-deductible contributions was initiated towards the construction of Greek Housing at the Pittsburgh Campus. The campaign called for each organization to raise \$100,000, and the University provided the remaining \$350,000 required for the projects completion.

Land was granted to each organization on a 99 year lease. The organizations now own and are granted exclusive use of the units. This successful project houses 200 students; approximately 5% of those housed on campus, and is governed by the Office of Student Activities.

2) University of California Davis

Cooperative Housing is available to students on campus at UC Davis. This housing is based on student management and student facility maintenance. Various costs of repairs and building improvement are negotiated between students and the University. Because of this fact, the university has the right to "recall" the building with sufficient notice. Originally, the three buildings were faculty housing or temporary dormatories.

3) University of Central Florida

The University of Central Florida developed a Greek park area on a 60 year lease arrangement for a flat rate of \$10.00. Because no federal financing was available, each organization was required to seek independent financing. Several Greek organizations have already initiated construction while others are continuing their fund raising.

4) Bowling Green State University

At BGSU, International and Cooperative housing was constructed in 1971. The project was financed through student's housing fees, similiar to those used for conventional residence halls construction. The International housing on campus is unique because students are granted a designated floor in residence halls. Both the university and students govern the facilities.

The Presidents of the Associated Students of the University of California are forwarding a proposal for the development, management and use of student funded facilities to be placed on a future agenda of the Council of Chancellors.

Due to the timeliness of this document and its importance to students we would appreciate your reviewing this document with the Chancellors prior to the end of this academic year.


In addition, we have suggested to the students on the Student Fee Advisory Committee (SFAC) that the document be placed on their May agenda.

INTRODUCTION

This document, presented by the Presidents of all the Associated Students of the University of California, was developed under the following general principles:

- 1. The need for consistency among campuses with flexibility to accommodate local institutions and procedures with respect to the expansion or development of student financed facilities.
- The avoidance of indirectly raising Registration fees beyond their legal definition and limits, by the creation of Incidental or Special Fees.
- 3. Students should be the primary governing body of student financed facilities through student majority governing boards.
- 4. The recognition that the University is the primary beneficiary of any new facility regardless of its funding source.

SECTION I: CRITERIA FOR USE OF INCIDENTAL AND REGISTRATION FEES

Consistent with State Policy that fees remain as low as possible, facilities shall be funded by student fees only after other sources of revenue have been exhausted.

In order for a facility to be funded by student fees (Incidental or Registration) the following criteria shall be met:

- (a) the facilities top usage priority must be for student noninstructional activities, defined by time and space
- (b) the facility shall be managed by a student majority board (see Section III).
- (c) the use of the facility for the following programs will not be funded by student fees and should be self supporting through rent or a proportion of the total cost of the facility. Maintenance costs must be included.
 - 1. Instructional purposes, including physical education.
 - 2. Commercial use, such as a Bookstore or Food Service. These services should be charged debt retirement and operational costs through rent or a proportion of gross or net profit subject to a contract decision by the facilities governing board. The expansion of those commercial activities managed by Associated Students or that direct their entire profits toward student service/student center programs are eligible for incidental fee funding.
 - 3. Non-student sponsored events or activities, that realize income.
 - 4. Faculty use of meeting rooms, recreational facilities, etc.
 - 5. Office space for University Administrative Units not financed by student fees.
- (d) A priority usage system must be developed by the facilities governing board for general lounges and meeting rooms. These need not be self sufficient.

If a facility meets the above minimum criteria, it is eligible to be funded either by Incidental or Registration fees. Incidental fees are appropriate to fund only non-academic facilities utilized for student extracurricular purposes, such as Student/University Centers, and Recreation Centers. These fees and their purpose must be listed clearly on the Campus Fee Statements. Legistration fees shall be eligible to fund non-academic extra-curricular facilities as well as facilities for student support services such as Career Services, Health Centers, Counseling and Psychological Services. The purpose of this fee definition is to avoid indirectly raising Registration fees by the creation of new Incidental fees.

SECTION II PROCESS FOR FEE REFERENDUM

In order to facilitate student participation prior to the development of a student facility deemed appropriate for student funding, a consistent criteria that can adequately address the needs of each campus must be created. Because many UC campuses have currently experienced, or are proposing, a referendum to create or increase incidental student fees, it is imperative that this criteria be consistent and reasonably based upon the individual situations of each campus. With this in mind, the following process for fee referendums is proposed:

A. Needs Assesment

Prior to the development or conception of a student facilities package proposal a campus needs assessment must be completed. It is suggested that the Associated Students, in conjunction with the student activities staff and existing facility governing boards, periodically assess the facility and programatic needs of the students. For example, requirement can be fulfilled by a student generated petition put onto the Associated Students General Election Ballot.

B. Development of Project

1. Establishment of Program/Building Advisory Committee.

If the need for a new student facility, which meets the above financial criteria is determined, an officially recognized program/building advisory committee shall be established. The membership of the committee shall have a majority of students, appointed by the Associated Students to be representative of appropriate student constituencies. At least one graduate student, appointed by the Graduate Student Association, must be on the committee. It is suggested that a representative from the Faculty, Staff Alumni and community also be appointed as ex-officio committee members. All committee meetings must be open and publicized.

2. Establishment of Subcommittee Facility Planning Groups.

Depending on the size of the project, it is recommended that subcommittees be established so as to focus student participation on the most significant aspects of the project. All subcommittees must have some student participation. All meetings must be open to the public and well publicized.

- 3. Suggested Format for Final Report
 - a. The Final Report must be completed during the academic year.
 - b. Subcommittees present final proposals/reports to the program/building advisory committee. Subcommittees and main

committee finalize a very detailed facilities package proposal.

- c. Full committee and/or designated subcommittee recommends building site. If this information cannot be obtained prior to student approval of the facility, at most 3 possible sites should be identified at this stage.
- d. Governance structure of the facilities finalized by the full committee.
- e. Full committee and/or designated subcommittee researches and recommends funding alternatives, including non-student financed. The committee will also decide the termination or further use of the student fee once the bond has been retired.
- f. Distribution of facility descriptions, site recommendations, and funding alternatives to all campus constituencies. To determine applicability to student and University needs through publications, feedback, surveys, etc.
- g. Full committee and/or designated subcommittee, subsequent to full committee approval, writes the referenda document.

C. Referendum on Facility Package, Site, and Funding Structure

- 1. Any referendum concerning student facilities or fees must be held through the Associated Students in accordance with their Election Codes and Constitution. The program/building advisory committee shall place the referendum on the ballot under the guidelines of the Associated Students.
- 2. Due to the fact that the University is the primary beneficiary of any new facility it is legitimate that the Associated Students request to solicit funds from the University to finance the referendum. The University should strive to help finance the referendum.
- 3. If the University spends any money on advocacy, information or oposition, they must also provide matching funds for the other sides argument if existent. Since the University possess many resources for influence, it is suggested that they not take a position on any student referendum regarding the financing of a new facility.
- 4. Minimum turnout requirement and percentage of positive vote necessary for approval, shall be established, in accordance with the Associated Students Election Codes and University policies and procedures, well in advance of the referendum.
- 5. The voting shall be conducted via A.S. and/or GSA Election Policies, respectively. Voting must not be conducted through the course registration or financial packages.

D. Post Referendum (Positive Vote)

- 1. The program/building advisory committee shall oversee the selection of the architects for the project. A subcommittee may be created with student majority to interview candidates in accordance with University bidding procedures.
- 2. The program/building advisory committee shall oversee the selection of site if it has not already been determined before the referendum.
- 3. The program/building advisory committee, or designated subcommittee(s), shall participate in all meetings with the project architect and shall be responsible for publicizing and approving the final design.
- 4. The program/building advisory committee shall oversee the construction of the facility.
- 5. The program/building advisory committee shall remain active until the facility is officially in use.

SECTION III MANAGEMENT OF STUDENT FUNDED FACILITY

A. Incidental Fees

- 1. Prior to the voting of a student fee referendum to create of a student facility financed by Special or Incidental fee, a management board shall be established. The board shall be recognized by the University prior to any referendum for collection of student fees, as the official governing board of the facility.
- 2. The board shall be composed of at least 2/3 students, appointed by the Associated Students to be representative of the appropriate student constituencies. At lease one of these students must be a graduate student appointed by the Graduate Student Association. The chairperson of the board shall be a student elected by the student body or chosen within the committee.
- 3. The jurisdiction of the board shall include the following, but not be limited to:
 - Development and Oversight of Facility Budget
 - Facility Space Allocation
 - General Use Policy
 - Facility Supervision
 - a. custodial standards, building maintenance
 - b. building security
 - c. landscaping
 - d. space utilization
 - e. energy management

- f. capital improvements
- g. equipment purchases and maintenance
- Personnel:

participation in the hiring, evaluation and supervision of key administrative personnel in accordance with University policies and procedures.

- Oversight and monitoring terms of Regental bonds.

B. Registration Fee

Any facility which is funded with the majority of Registration Fees shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Registration Fee Advisory Committee.

WHEREAS, SB7 is, in effect, a part of the effort to deny all women the right to choose an abortion;





SUBJECT: Gays, Lesbians and Bisexuals in the UC

The ASUCSD passed the following resolution:

WHEREAS, discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation is widespread in the University of California,

WHEREAS, homophobia and hysteria has increased in the University of California as a result of the AIDS crisis,

WHEREAS, institutional barriers prevent the full participation of openly gay, lesbian and bisexual students, staff, faculty and administrators in the University of California,

WHEREAS, the University of California should encourage equality of opportunity for all persons, regardless of their sexual orientation,

WHEREAS, gay, lesbian, and bisexual students are an oppressed group in the University of California, often considered inferior human beings by heterosexuals, and

WHEREAS, the University of California Regents recognized that it should eliminate such discrimination by the adoption of its policy on prohibiting discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation (in June 1982),

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the ASUCSD endorse the University of California Student Association requests that the President of the University of California form an Advisory Committee on the Status of Gays, Lesbians and Bisexuals in the University of California, which would include the following representatives:

- 2 Students nominated by the University of California Student Association
- 2 Faculty members nominated by the UC Academic Senate,
- 2 Staff members, one nominated by the UC Staff Assembly and one nominated by the union with the largest staff membership,
- 2 Adminstrators, selected by the UC President, and
- 2 Alumni nominated by the President of the UC Alumni Association

At least one representative from each of the five listed catagories should be openly gay, lesbian, or bisexual.

Be it further resolved that the Advisory Committee will address the following issues:

- a. Investigate the institutional barriers to the admittance and academic success of gay, lesbian and bisexual students in the California secondary and post-secondary education system. Develop policies to eliminate these barriers to academic success.
- b. Investigate barriers to societal acceptance of gays, lesbians, and bisexuals. Determine what actions the University of California can take to break down these barriers.
- c. Develop public education programs that will help dispel myths and misconceptions about gays, lesbians and bisexuals in the University of California.
- d. Investigate the feasibility of including gays, lesbians, and bisexual in the EOP/SAA programs of the University of California, or new institutional programs to ensure their recruitment, retention and acceptance in the University of California.
- e. Investigation of the effectiveness of Regental Policy on non-discrimination in career service, housing, employment and other appropriate areas to the University.
- f. Other areas relating to the participation of gays, lesbians and bisexuals in the University of California.

Relocation means dissolving and moving a once close knit completely self-sufficient society to city suburbs where they often fail to adjust due to language barrier, inability to find employment which often forces them to go on welfare and in addition, both they and their children frequently fall prey to alcoholism, drug abuse, and suicide;
