

Paul Gaulin to perform with Paul Gaulin Mime Company

Paul Gaulin, called "the Buster Keaton of mime" by Marcel Marceau, will perform with the Paul Gaulin Mime Company at the University of California, San Diego Thursday, March 6.

The performance will begin at 8 p.m. in the Mandeville Auditorium. General admission is \$5 and tickets cost \$4 for students and UCSD faculty and staff and \$3 for UCSD students. Tickets are available at the UCSD Central Box Office, 452-4559.

Gaulin, a Canadian by birth, studied mime in Paris under Etienne Decroux and the celebrated Marceau. Gaulin's choreography and the execution of the pieces are balletic in style. His approach is brilliantly innovative and in each vignette, Gaulin interprets the human condition using his simple, eloquent technique.

"I know of no other group in North America at the present time which can match the expertise of this enthusiastic group of performers," wrote Allan Splete of New York's St. Lawrence University. "Imagination and creativity are bywords of this outstanding group."
