Following has an affair of it's concern to transact at home
but that you send to us notice of it as I shall tell it of
again at next post here

Received the above yesterday, which have had every bad night
a return of pain, again in one hour the somewhat easier this
morning, and since the above a little worse than former which
I send you below

I send but now to ^{Dr. Monk} the offer to know if you are in the
posse for a favor, he sends me word it is not yet made out
but will let you know as soon as it is

1749

Dear Thom.

I have had your several letters to bid that directed
to Anna of Bap, one by appellee who did not get her till today
came last yesterday by Westmoreland last

I am very glad to hear of your safe delivery of adam
and wish the boy to well, as to a name & Maria wrote
your mother, I entirely submit to her & your selves, as I
know she is anxious of having her father name left up
I am very willing she should do it

Within three days after I got to Town I was sick with
the joint which has confined me to my bed ever since & just
I have had it very severely all of one side, but just now able
to set up & sit upon in my bed. But I hope now I shall soon be
able to go about again, my health & confinement lies but
it out of my power, to give you any of the occurrences here
several small ships come in & leave for North America, last Monday
is come & started to British Hospital to Moncks Bay, most people
& more written are Dr. Howells, Burnside, Alexander left soon, a very
Capt Burn, in they intended load at Samana & Coon & Burner
who are all arrived & have had no opportunity of seeing any
yet

As to terms of sugar I can send you now as follows
As there is none yet home, the buyers all by sugar can afford
well at Kingston to fixed the prices as were from 15/ to 26/-
the same has been some sold since at 28. But the planters have
determined not to sell at those prices, when the prices at
home are not so low in proportion. Sugar being there as high as
40 if not higher out of sale came over lately of 38

I cant be of opinion with you that 20/ per min. here will be
better than shipping it unless you mean the word with

that I take it is already ship'd and what we have of us now to be good sugar, Mr Morgan told me he says some sugar at Saxon Baking house full as good as Catt heads, & Catt head told me last yesterday not (awfully) offend him a pistol a hundred for it & take all he had and for really think such sugar as we were sending when I came may (and not be left to be seen 2 or 3 twenty hilling, and I should readily agree with you in selling sugar full round any tolerable price, howver I leave it entirely to you to do as you mean in that affair, and I am to let out Hamilton have some sugars which I suppose he will get out at the same rate, the 1. time I ought to make adifference in his price with other as he does all the deals with of the sugar demand let him have terms proposed, now of he will give a good price, & if none of no other I have to pay these but Capt. M. Edwards and

If you have not already shipped 10 tuns more on Catt head may omit it & ship them on Capt Darfinsons ship or if you can't sometimes get so much more to do it, if you don't pay awfully in sugars would have you ship about 20 tuns more on his ship that of my own for his debt that we know that I may due are the value in short demand, you ship it all as fast as can get it down pay expence it well, and on ^{any} fast ship you shall ^{have} profit, know I could not do it to sell under 2/6 per Gall as long as you can get room to put it in, If Nash dont send home Marquam's negroes may send her them & sell about fitting selling

(or getting, & getting ready to hit as many tuns as possible against we can share the space to send when Marquam's negroes come back Hollingsay, & it to saving directly

I think you see you care if the deposition have alreaded left Catt head men, but there will be no suspicion of any now but at coverys of the constable evidence, which he says is sufficient to exculpate one from the charge of the indictment which was a neglect of duty in my office & that I must send a subpoena for to J^d Court, but would have you say nothing of it, the attorney general has been extreamly well on this occasion, & made light of the thing, but advises me to let it be tried at Court, when I may prosecute him if I think fit, say tell me friends of Melo the Jew is in the transatlantic United, of Scotland find him I must suppose you do say

I detained the paper so long not being able to write till now, I send by Mr Morgan, the first weekly journal of the State of the openly being now said to be printed of the promised to forward them direct to you, this last week is not yet sent, and I don't know the occasion of it, but I purpose to send them you all as published, for the information of the people of the Province, I dont get news if you are on the service for a fury soon.
