

NSF to hold summer program in oceanography on Scripps campus

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Approximately 25 high school students - both boys and girls - will be given a golden opportunity to study oceanography and marine biology "in the big time" at Scripps Institution of Oceanography this summer.

An eight-week summer program, sponsored by the National Science Foundation, will be held on the Scripps campus of the University of California, San Diego, from June 21 to August 3. It is aimed at superior secondary school students giving them their first taste of full-scale laboratory research.

The program will be research oriented. Each student will be individually assigned to a professor and will serve as a junior member of a research team in laboratory investigations. The UCSD campus has offered similar summer training to high school students for the past seven years through National Science Foundation grants.
