UCSD Extension is pleased to announce that Christine Todd Whitman, former two-term governor of New Jersey and EPA administrator from 2001 through 2003, will speak on Thursday, February 10th, 7:00-8:30 p.m., as part of UCSD's Revelle Forum at The Neurosciences Institute, a series of lectures and public interviews with leading figures from the worlds of arts and culture, current events, and the media. Ms. Whitman will present a provocative critique of the Republican Party's turn to the right and an impassioned plea for a return to its moderate roots. Admission to this event is \$35 per person. One of the most powerful women in the Republican Party, Christine Todd Whitman presents a revealing, reasoned critique of her party's ideological turn to the right and a rallying call for a return to its moderate roots. In her forthcoming book, *It's My Party Too*, Whitman—a former two-term governor of New Jersey who retired as the Bush administration's EPA administrator in 2003—takes readers inside the tumultuous world of politics today. She argues passionately and provocatively against the takeover of her party by zealous "social fundamentalists" who, she contends, violate traditional Republican principles and are holding the party back from achieving a true majority.
