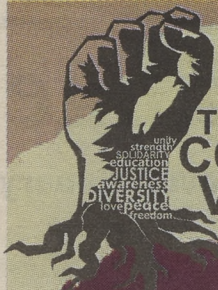

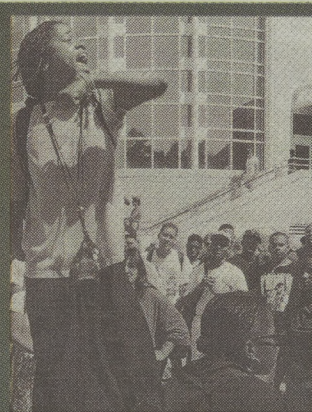
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The Struggle for Institutional Change

After years of facing an oppressive campus climate, communities mobilize in support of revolutionary demands.

The recent event regarding the Compton Cookout and the remark made on behalf of the Koala newspaper have caused real pain and fear among students of color on this campus. It has created divisions and hostilities among the UCSD community yet it has brought different communities together like never before. Solidarity across the numerous students organizations, faculty, staff, graduate students, medical students, workers, and different UC campuses has demonstrated that in the face of racism and hate, love and courage unite us.

The combination of years of feeling isolated and unwanted along with the recent events during these past two weeks have forced the Black Student Union to declare a State of Emergency. This is a direct message to administrators and the overall community that students of color will no longer idly maintain a university that values "diversity" only at face value when it is clearly physically, culturally and socially separated from the San Diego community and its people.

As a first generation student, Chicana, and MEChista from the city of Compton, I stand in complete solidarity with my brothers and sisters of BSU and countless others that have spoken against the hateful acts by these misguided individuals. Our message goes beyond these individuals and seeks to create a university that truly serves and values everyone and not just the economically and racially privileged. We seek a university that acknowledges and abolishes the fundamental racist, sexist, homophobic, and classist practices that UCSD was built upon. To accomplish this is to ensure that the administration and the overall campus recognize that there is RACISM IN OUR COMMUNITY.

To those who have misunderstood our message, have called us troublemakers, and cannot understand what the big deal is: understand that our actions are a product of years of activism by past students of color. We are the result of those students who skipped class in order to attend countless meetings, organized their own high school conferences, fought for the Cross-Cultural Center, fought for the LGBTRC, fought for the Women's Center, fought for SPACES, attended protests, organized events, fought for

Affirmative Action, fought for justice, and created safe spaces... for the marginalized communities on campus. We understand that we are students today because of the unrecognized labor and dedication of these activists and we recognize our position as the tokenized few that made it into this university. We stand together and struggle to see the transformation of this university from one that values profit and reputation into one that is aware, accountable, responsive and at the service of the diverse communities of San Diego and its youth.

Given our 10 point platform, the Collective Voice supports the struggle to transform this university into one that truly values and serves its diverse student population. We therefore stand in solidarity with the seven demands presented by the Black Student Union. We hope to provide an outlet for freedom of expression that promotes peace not hate. We hope to manifest the message that is otherwise misrepresented by the Guardian and the Koala. We, as a collective, stand with and for the people. We are accountable to our community. We are a product of activism. We are activism.

Raise your right fist We will unite And fight this. We will not accept less Than magnified resistance So stand with us (Cuz you don't want to be against us).



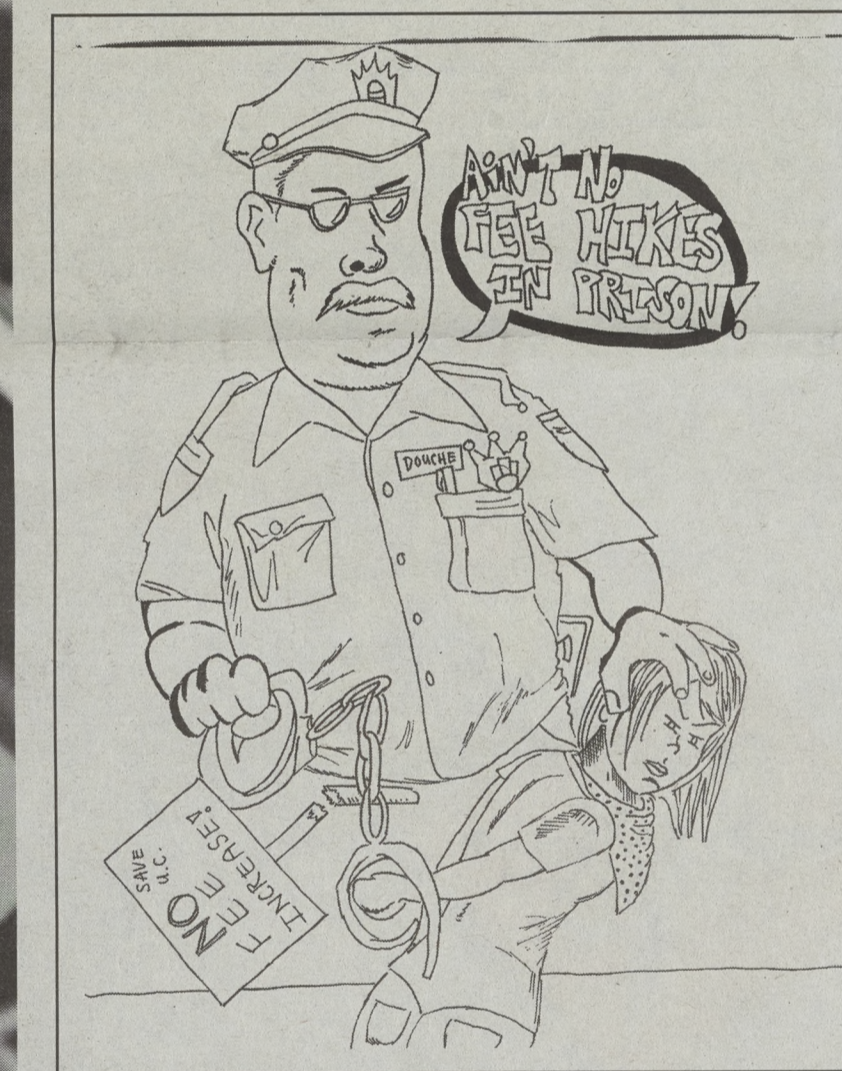
Understand Me

BICD 136 AIDS SCIENCE & SOCIETY

Gustafson-Brown

An introduction to all aspects of the AIDS epidemic. Topics will include the epidemiology, biology, and clinical aspects of HIV infection, HIV testing, education and approaches to therapy, and the social, political, and legal impacts of AIDS on the individual and society. In order to count for their major, biology majors must take the upper-division course, BICD 136. **Prerequisites:** BILD 1, BILD 2 recommended.

CGS 101 Gender, Modernity, and Globalization

Volyes

In this course, we will critically interrogate how the modern world is constructed through the technologies of patriarchy, settler colonialism, racism, violence, and capitalist resource exploitation. We will focus on the ways in which the intersectionality of gender with race, sexuality, and class has worked to organize the modern colonial world and new (old?) patterns of globalization. Using transnational feminist theory, postcolonial theory, and indigenous studies, the course will destabilize the “post” of postcolonialism, question what is both new and old about globalization, and unmask the function of power as it traverses different kinds of borders. Throughout, we will keep a keen eye on the role of gender in shaping modern social projects, and the very real material implications of gender for communities and individuals alike.

CGS 104 Advanced Topics in Comparative Perspectives: The Comparative State of Global Gender Equality

Gilson

In study after study published in the last twenty years, everyone from the World Bank, to the United Nations, and the joint Chiefs of Staff of the US military has recognized, as a statement from Doctors Without Borders put it: “Progress is achieved through women.” The investment bank, Goldman Sachs

issued a report in 2008 that said "Gender inequality hurts economic growth." This course will be a survey of the state of gender equality around the world. We will look at education, health, access to employment, violence against women, and the implications of the feminization of immigration and what states and international institutions are doing and not doing to create gender equality.

CGS 105 Queer Theory Kaplan

Examines the different methodologies and disciplinary histories that together constitute the interdisciplinary project called queer studies. Of particular interest will be how these different methodologies and history construe and construct the relations between gender, race, class, and nation.

680242 TuTh 9:30-10:50 am PCYNH 120

ETHN 1C introduction to Ethnic Studies: Race and Ethnic Relations in the U.S. Yang

This course examines the theoretical literature on race and ethnicity, focusing on issues of domination and subordination, and the historical emergence of racism and ethnic conflict. Attention is given to class and gender differences within racial and ethnic groups.

ETHN 122 Asian-American Culture and Identity TBA

A survey of Asian-American cultural expressions in literature, art, and music to understand the social experiences that helped forge Asian-American identity. Topics: culture conflict, media portrayals, assimilation pressures, the model minority myth, and interethnic and class relations.

HIUS 115 History of Sexuality Shah

Constructions of sex and sexuality in the United States from the time of pre-contact Native America to the present, focusing on sexual behaviors, sexual ideologies, and the uses of sexuality for social control.

HIUS 124/ETHN 125 Asian American History Shah

Explore how Asian Americans were involved in the political, economic, and cultural formation of United States society. Topics include migration; labor systems; gender, sexuality and social organization; racial ideologies and anti-Asian movements; and nationalism and debates over citizenship.

HIUS 131 Cultural History from the Civil War to the Present Klien

This course will focus on the transformation of work and leisure and the development of consumer culture. Students will consider connections between culture, class relations, gender ideology, and politics. Topics will include labor radicalism, Taylorism, the development of organized sports, the rise of department stores, the transformation of middle-class sexual morality, the growth of commercial entertainment, and the culture of the cold war.

LTCS 130 Gender, Race/Ethnicity, Class & Culture El-Tayeb

The course will focus on the representation of gender, ethnicity, and class in cultural production in view of various contemporary theories of race, sex, and class. Repeatable for credit when topics vary.

LTWL 87 Freshman Seminar: Sex & Love in the Middle Ages Staff

PSYC 158 Interpersonal Relations Harris

Seminar-style course to examine theories and empirical work pertaining to interpersonal relationships; attraction, jealousy, attachments, love. **Prerequisite:** upper-division standing.

PSYC 190 Parenting Roberts

This course adopts an interdisciplinary approach to the complex construct of parenting. Parenting is explored with respect to history, culture, development, psychology, biology, etc. Controversial issues such as the influence of the media, family structure, and discipline strategies are analyzed. **Prerequisite:** upper-division standing.

SOCI 129 The Family Klatch

An examination of historical and social influences on family life. Analyzes contemporary families in the United States, the influences of gender, class, and race, and current issues such as divorce, domestic violence, and the feminization of poverty. **Prerequisite:** upper-division standing. Will not receive credit for SOCI 129 and SOCC 129

SOCI 139 Social Inequality: Class, Race, and Gender Jacob-Almeida

Massive inequality in wealth, power, and prestige is ever-present in industrial societies. In this course, causes and consequences of class, gender, racial, and ethnic inequality ("stratification") will be considered through examination of classical and modern social science theory and research. **Prerequisite:** upper-division standing. Will not receive credit for SOCI 139 and SOCC 139.
