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# Recent California Campus Events: And the Importance of Out & Proud Week

Dear UC San Diego LGBT and Ally community,

As we begin Out & Proud Week, we want to highlight the very real violence that members of our community are experiencing across California campuses.

As you may be aware, at CSU Long Beach a violent, disturbing incident took place earlier this month directed against a transgender man. This incident highlights the extreme reactions of some to our transgender community. It certainly raises all of our sensitivities to the potential for violence here at UC San Diego around gender expression, and particularly for gender queer and transgender people.

There was a hate crime at CSU, Chico. At UC Davis, there was hate vandalism at Rainbow House and more swastikas have been drawn on a building at UC Berkeley.

You may already be aware of some of these. At UC San Diego, our own campus, we have experienced much visible hate recently. While we know that many of these incidents are underreported and are therefore less visible, we also want everyone to know that you have resources here at UC San Diego. You have people who value your identity, your voice, and your presence on campus. As we came together to support one another after the incidents last quarter, we must continue to take care of one another. We want to take this opportunity to remind you of the resources that are available on campus. If you are upset, distraught, or just want to talk with someone about these things and/or your own experiences please use the resources available to you.

We look forward to a powerful Out & Proud Week, while remembering the violence and the pain that has been occurring on our campus, and other campuses throughout California. As we come together to be Out & Proud, let's take care of one another, treat each other with kindness, respect and understanding, support each other, continue to learn, grow and create a better campus climate for all people.

### Gender 101
