Melvin J. Voigt, University Librarian at the San Diego campus of the University of California will visit Paris March 11 to 15 for a meeting of UNESCO's International Advisory Committee on Bibliography, Documentation, and Terminology.

Voigt represents the United States States of this committee. He has just accepted an invitation from Rene Maheu, Director-General of UNESCO, to serve a second term.

The Committee's activities include the development of libraries and assistance in publishing national bibliographies in the developing countries of the world; training of specialists in librarianship and documentation; coordination of worldwide publishing of subject bibliographies, particularly in the sciences; development of new methods for handling the rapidly increasing output of scientific information throughout the world; and standardization of terminology in all fields.
