

Pianist Malcolm Frager to appear

Malcolm Frager, one of today's most eloquent pianists, will appear at 8:30 p.m. on Friday, November 15, at Sherwood Hall in La Jolla. He is being presented by the Arts and Lectures Committee at the University of California, San Diego.

In 1959 he won the Edgar M. Leventritt Award and won the First Prize at the Queen Elisabeth of Belgium Competition in 1960. Frager is the only pianist who has won them both.

He has toured the Soviet Union (25 concerts with standing ovations), 17 countries in Europe and 9 in South America. In this country his distinguished list of engagements includes a command performance at the White House, the inaugural performance of the New York Philharmonic at Lincoln Center and appearances with the Boston Symphony Orchestra at Tanglewood for six consecutive summers.

His program at Sherwood Hall will include "Wuerttemberg Sonata No. 2 in A-Flat Major" by C.P.E. Bach, "Sonata in F minor, Opus 57" by Beethoven, "Moment Musical, Opus 94, Nos. 2, 3 and 4" by Schubert and "Symphonic Etudes, Opus 13" by Schumann.
