

Dr. L. Subramaniam to give violin concert

One of India's most gifted violinists will perform the classical music of his country in a concert scheduled at 3 p.m. Sunday, October 19, at the University of California, San Diego.

The concert will take place in room 2250 of the Humanities and Social Sciences Building on the university's Muir campus. Admission is \$5 for the general public, \$3 for students and \$2 for children under 12.

Dr. L. Subramaniam began his concert career when he was 8 years old. He has toured the world playing South Indian music and has recorded albums with Ravi Shankar and George Harrison.

Accompanying Subramaniam are instrumentalists who play the mridangam, or South Indian drum; a clay pot called the ghatam; an unfretted drone instrument called the tambura, and the shruti-peti, a small instrument which uses a system of bellows to produce sound.

The concert is sponsored by the India Club of UC San Diego and the India Association of San Diego.
