The UC San Diego Hispanic Scholarship Council will host its 16th annual *Fiesta de las Estrellas* April 25 to raise scholarship funds for outstanding students, with an opportunity for donors to meet the students whose lives will be transformed by their gift. Translated "Celebration of the Stars," the event will honor 17 "star" UC San Diego scholarship recipients. Since *Fiesta* was established, the event has raised more than \$1 million to help ensure that talented and motivated students from all backgrounds have the opportunity to acquire a world-class education at UC San Diego.
