

1984 Commencement ceremonies to be held

June 4, 1984

Commencement ceremonies honoring the graduates of the four colleges and the graduate studies program at the University of California, San Diego will be held on the campus Sunday, June 17.

Approximately 2,000 students are eligible to take part in the five ceremonies, including some 410 from Third College, 561 from Warren College, 365 from Revelle College and 647 from Muir College. Of the approximately 390 degree recipients in the graduate program, about 80 will attend the ceremony.

The graduation ceremonies of the four UCSD undergraduate colleges have traditionally been scheduled at different times of the day, allowing students from one college to attend the ceremonies involving friends and colleagues at the other colleges. Dr. Richard C. Atkinson, UCSD chancellor, will spend the day in cap and gown taking part in each of the ceremonies to extend official campus greetings and congratulations to graduates and visitors.

The Muir College commencement will begin at 9:30 a.m. on the lawn between Third College and Mandeville Center near the "Sun God" sculpture. Rolf Benirschke, place kicker for the San Diego Chargers football team, will give the address. Muir ceremonies traditionally open with a bagpipe and drum processional in honor of John Muir's Scottish heritage, led by Pipe Master John H. Rosenberger. Muir College Provost "Chips" Dreilinger will confer degrees, and a reception will follow in the Muir courtyard.

The Warren College commencement will start at 10:30 a.m. at the south lawn of the Humanities-Library Building near the most recent acquisition of The Stuart Collection, "The La Jolla Project," by sculptor Richard Fleischner. The graduation address will be given by Dr. Z Kripke, an associate physician for both the UCSD Student Health Center and the Department of Community Medicine, UCSD School of Medicine. Warren Provost Dr. Michael Addison will confer degrees. After the ceremony, a reception will take place in the Warren Commons area.

Dr. Arnold Mandell, winner of a prestigious MacArthur Fellowship and professor, UCSD Department of Psychiatry, will deliver the graduate studies commencement address. The ceremony will start at noon in Mandeville Center Auditorium. Each doctoral and master of fine arts candidate will be hooded by his or her advisor. The tradition is a holdover from medieval times and is a significant event for the participants. Chancellor Atkinson will confer graduate degrees and Dr. Richard Attiyeh, dean of graduate studies and research, will preside.

The Revelle College ceremony will begin at 2 p.m. on the lawn south of the Humanities-Library Building. The speaker will be former Revelle Provost Chia-Wei Woo, now president of San Francisco State University. Degrees will be conferred jointly by Acting Provost Dr. F. Thomas Bond and Dr. Roger Revelle. The Revelle College reception will take place after the ceremonies on the north lawn of the Humanities-Library Building.

The Third College commencement ceremony is scheduled for 3 p.m. on the lawn between Third College and the Mandeville Center. Dr. William R. Frazer, vice president of academic affairs for the University of California, will give the graduation address. Degrees will be conferred jointly by Provost Faustina Solis and Chancellor Atkinson. Third College has a unique tradition which allows students to have two family members accompany them as they cross the stage to receive their degrees.
