

The National Theatre of the Deaf to perform

The National Theatre of the Deaf, a stage company that combines sign language, narration and singing to create the theater of visual language, will perform at 8 p.m. Sunday, November 5, in the Mandeville Auditorium on the University of California, San Diego campus.

The theater company performs in sign language which is simultaneously translated into spoken words. Over the past 11 years, the company has toured the United States, including two Broadway appearances. It has performed on PBS's "Sesame Street" and the CBS special "A Child's Christmas in Wales."

Front seating has been reserved for deaf members of the audience in order to make it as easy as possible to read the sign language on stage. Tickets for the performance are \$5.50 for general admission and \$3 for all students. Tickets are available at the UCSD Central Box Office, 452-4559.

The performance is being held in conjunction with Disabled Student Awareness Week on campus, October 30-November 5.
