

Dr. Lawrence Powell to give eighth seminar in Librarianship

Dr. Lawrence C. Powell, Dean of the School of Librarianship at the University of California, Los Angeles is scheduled to give the eighth in a series of seminars in librarianship at the San Diego campus of the University, Monday, April 19.

Dr. Powell will talk on "Collection Building for University Libraries" at 4:00 p.m. in room 2130, Building B, on the UCSD campus. The seminars, which began six months ago, are free and open to librarians from all San Diego libraries. They have covered a variety of topics relating to library management and operation.

Formerly University Librarian at UCLA, Dr. Powell is well known both as librarian and author. He has championed the cause of books and libraries vigorously and effectively for many years. The UCLA School of Librarianship, which he worked hard to create, has established an enviable reputation in its four years of operation.

The UCLA Library, under his direction, grew from a small college library to an outstanding research library.
