Dear Leo,

I am happy to be able to announce that Academic Press, Incorporated is instituting a new Advances Series, entitled "Advances in Gerontological Research" which, it is intended, will fill the need for current, critical syntheses and reviews of topics in the Biology of Aging. As editor of this forthcoming series I am most anxious to aim for high quality in the contributed articles and to insure as much as possible that the various important areas of the field receive adequate coverage.

I would therefore very much appreciate your considering writing a current topical critique and synthesis on the subject "Time Measurement and Meaning" or a closely related title of your own choosing if this suggested topic is not suitable. Orientation should generally be toward the Basic Problem of Aging rather than other less germane extensions of the subject wherever possible. The deadline for receipt of completed manuscripts will be December 15, 1962.

Royalties will be at the rate of 8% of the page-pro-rated-retail-selling-price within the United States and 4% for sales outside the United States.

Could I hear from you within the next few weeks regarding your interest in contributing to the first volume of this series? Also, could you indicate a tentative date for receipt of the completed manuscript? Articles should be between 20 and 40 printed pages in length and should consist of a thorough review and bibliography of past findings as well as an exposition of your current findings and outlook.
