

The New Age String Trio under direction of Albert Gillis will present three performances at UCSD

The New Age String Trio under the direction of Albert Gillis will present three performances at the University of California, San Diego Tuesday and Wednesday, February 6 and 7.

The concerts, sponsored by the UCSD Music Department, are free and open to the public.

Jim Stark, violin, Susan Bates, viola, and Nancy Cousins, 'cello, make up the trio which recently won first prize in the Monterey Peninsula Chamber Music Competition held in Carmel. There were nine chamber groups competing.

On February 6, the trio will perform at noon in the Humanities-Library Auditorium on the Revelle Campus and at 5 p.m. in 2250 Humanities & Social Sciences Bldg. on the John Muir College campus.

On February 7 the trio will perform a Beethoven string trio and the difficult "Schoenberg String Trio" which was commissioned by Harvard University. The performance will be at 8:30 p.m. in the Recital Hall, Bldg. 409 on the Matthews Campus.

The three instrumentalists were members of the New Age String Quartet and have performed extensively in music centers in California, Colorado, Louisiana, and Texas. Several compositions by outstanding composers were written especially for the group. Gillis, who is presently a visiting professor in chamber music and string instruments at UCSD, has worked with the group for six years.
