UCSD students, staff, faculty and alumni are invited to UCSD Night at the San Diego Symphony at 7 p.m. on Thursday, January 27.

Orchestra seats are on sale for \$4 per ticket for this performance. UCSD students, staff, faculty and alumni may purchase these discounted tickets, which are available only through the UCSD Central Box Office.

David Atherton will conduct at UCSD Night at the San Diego Symphony. The program includes "Harold in Italy" by Berlioz, based on Lord Byron's epic poem "Childe Harold."

Guest artist Csaba Erdelyi, a young Hungarian violist of international repute, will be featured in the Berlioz piece. Erdelyi is currently Professor of Viola at Trinity College of Music in London.

The San Diego Master Chorale will join the orchestra for Verdi's "Te Deum," an ancient Christian rite of thanksgiving expressed in sacred song. Verdi was so pleased with the final movement of "Te Deum" that he wished the original score buried with him.

"Flos Campi" by Ralph Vaughan Williams will also feature the San Diego Master Chorale and violist Csaba Erdelyi. Vaughan Williams scored "Flos Campi" ("Flower of the Fields") for solo viola, small orchestra and eight-part wordless chorus. Its performance by the San Diego Symphony and Master Chorale is attracting national attention.
