Spid town 18th May 1756

There seems no doubt of Mr Moors being Lieut. Governor, & that he will have directions to dissolve the present, & call a new assembly directly, who are to determine the dispute between the two Towns; in that case, the more respectable the Majority is in favor of the Country Interest, so much the more weight will their Proceedings have with our King & his Ministry - You will therefore excuse our Urging you to declare yourself a Candidate for St. James, together with Mr Tho. Reed (or such other friends as you agree upon among yourselves) & that you will lose no time in making your Interest. You will communicate the Contents of this Letter ^{only} to Mr Sarnham & such friends as you know & can confide in, & enjoin them to secrecy, and ^{don't} part with it out of your Custody. We wish you Success & are Sir
