

Abstract of the Will of the late Mr. Robert Kenyon  
Dated

After directing Debts &c to be paid he gives £100 for the purchase of a lot of land at Montego Bay for the use of Christiana Hall and her issue whose freedom he likewise directs to be purchased

£300. --- is bequeathed to his natural daughter Mary Kenyon by C. Hall the Interest of which is to be applied towards her maintenance and education till she attains the age of 18 years or day of marriage

£300. --- is bequeathed to another natural daughter Martha Kenyon in like manner to be laid out in the purchase of Negroes for her.

£300. --- in like manner to a natural Son Robert Kenyon

£300. --- in like manner to the child or children the before mentioned C. Hall is now pregnant with.

Four Negroes Robert, Ralph, John, & Ben left in trust for the use of Christiana Hall and her issue. ---

£100. --- to Mrs. Elizabeth Smyth

Shirt Brooch, Gold Watch, Chain &c, and a Ring to Mr. Edward Kenyon. ---

George Watson his Executors. ---
