

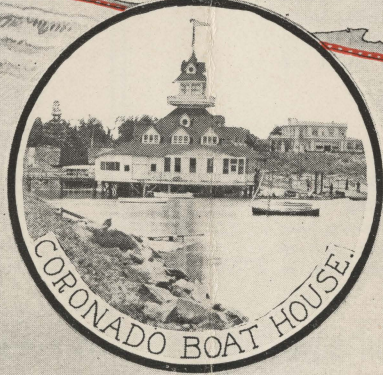
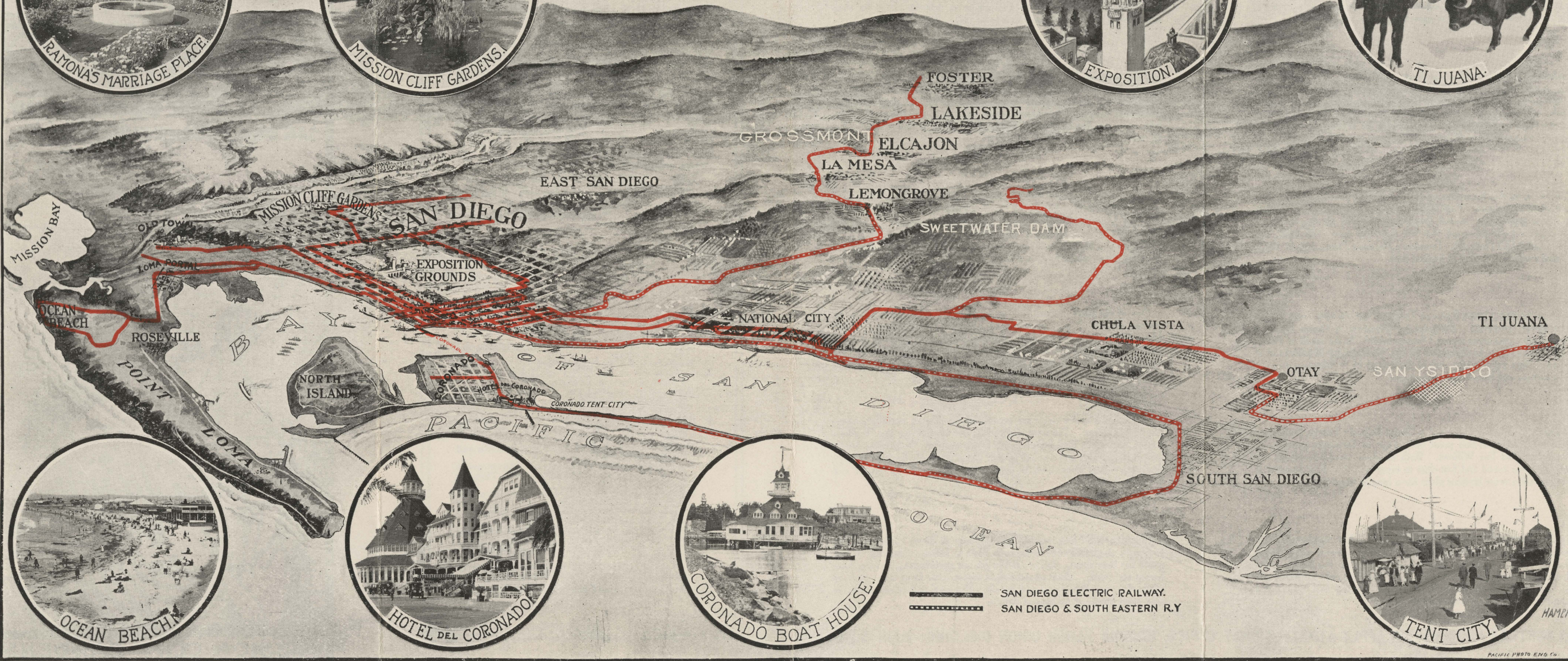

10c.

MISSION CLIFF GARDENS

One of the most beautiful botanical gardens and view spots in California. Overlooks Mission Valley and San Diego Mission (one of the oldest in State.) There is a large aviary, housing over 300 song birds; deer paddock and pavilion. The gardens are owned and maintained by the San Diego Electric Railway Company. Admission free. Take car 1, north, on Fifth street. This car passes Exposition grounds.

15c.

HOTEL DEL CORONADO

Undoubtedly the greatest resort hotel in America, open all the year. Covers nearly five acres. Within a stone's throw of beach, and almost entirely surrounded by semi-tropical foliage and beautifully parked grounds. Is conducted on the American plan. The Coronado Country Club, the scene of International Polo events in Winter, and Golf and Tennis tournaments during Winter and Summer, is near by. Cars 9 or 10.

RAMONA'S MARRIAGE PLACE

Old Town, on No. 8 car line, was the beginning of California; location of first white settlement. First Mission established here 1769. Monument marks spot where General Fremont planted U. S. flag in 1846. Other sights are old graveyard, first jail, first palm trees, 140 years old, Indian couple, 120 years old. Ramona's Marriage Place, built in 1825, and since partially restored, is located here.

25c.

POINT LOMA AND OCEAN BEACH

Reached by Point Loma Railroad Company electric cars from Fourth and Broadway (D street.) The principal attraction at Ocean Beach is the mammoth amusement resort, "Wonderland." To the south of Ocean Beach is Point Loma, headquarters for the Theosophical Brotherhood of America. Here may be seen one of the largest U. S. Wireless stations, Fort Rosecrans and Bennington monument.

ALPINE--THE WILLOWS

Alpine is thirty miles east, via San Diego & South Eastern Railway to Lakeside, connecting at this point with stage to Descanso, passing Ye Alpine Tavern and The Willows. Both of these mountain resorts are popular the year round and first-class in every respect. It is doubtful if one could find a more inviting place for a long or short stay.

SAN YSIDRO

Headquarters of the "Little Landers" colony. The members of this colony started out with the belief that one acre, properly tilled, would support a family in plenty, and are demonstrating this today. San Ysidro is fourteen miles south on the San Diego & South Eastern Railway. This town has grown in a wonderful manner, and now has a population of several hundred inhabitants.

CORONADO BOAT HOUSE, CORONADO

Where Power, Sail and Row Boats may be rented by hour or day. Launches for fishing parties to kelp beds and Coronado Islands, equipped with heavy, medium and light tackle, bait, etc. The fastest excursion boat on the Pacific Coast just completed for Coronado Boat House, and is in service, making regular trips to places of interest. May be chartered for picnics, etc. Phone Coronado 100. Take cars 9 or 10.

TIJUANA AND SWEETWATER DAM

Take National City car at Third and Broadway (D street) at 8:55 a. m., changing at National City to steam train leaving at 9:40 a. m. for Tijuana and Sweetwater Dam. Ample time will be had to see boundary monument, fort, scene of recent battles, curio stores, customs office, partake of a genuine Spanish dinner and be back in San Diego in the afternoon. A most interesting trip.

GROSSMONT

LAKESIDE

Grossmont (elevation 1200 feet above sea level), fourteen miles east of San Diego, on San Diego and South Eastern Railway, is the Summer home of Madame Schumann-Heink, the famous contralto. From the summit of Grossmont a remarkable view is presented of mountains of California and Mexico, as well as the city, Point Loma, ocean and bay. Lakeside, six miles beyond, is a noted resort.

CHULA VISTA

One of the many pleasant trips to be taken to suburban towns is by electric car from Third and Broadway (D street) to National City and Chula Vista. Both are attractive, growing communities of great promise, and close to the best citrus fruit region of the country. National City is four miles from San Diego; Chula Vista seven miles and near the bay.

WARNER'S HOT SPRINGS

Famous as a health resort on account of the known curative properties of its springs. The town and springs are located on the Warner's Ranch, one of the largest land grants in the county. Sixty miles north-east of San Diego, and reached by San Diego & South Eastern Railway to Foster, where connection is made with stage to Santa Ysabel and Warner's Springs.

JULIAN

Elevation 4300 feet; reached by San Diego & South Eastern Railway to Foster; stage thirty-two miles from there to Julian. This trip is well worth the time spent. Julian's industries are apple-raising, mining, lumbering and stock. Many semi-precious stones come from here, such as tourmaline, sapphire, topaz and garnet. The gold and silver mines in past years produced millions of dollars.
