Following are a couple of possible feature ideas involving students at the University of California, San Diego:

During the summer two groups of UC San Diego students visited rather exotic locations. One group spent several weeks in Jerusalem where they assisted on the archaeological dig for the Temple of David, a controversial enterprise which precipitated violent demonstrations by orthodox Jews. The other group of students, all undergraduates, visited the People's Republic of China, the first time UC San Diego undergraduates have made such a tour. According to tour leader Dr. Paul Pickowicz, director of the UCSD Chinese Studies Program, many of the students were of Chinese descent and used the opportunity to meet relatives in the PRC for the first time.
