

Dr. Schaefer appointed science adviser to Secretary Udall

Dr. Milner B. Schaefer, fisheries expert and veteran oceanographer, has been appointed science adviser to Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall.

An Interior Department announcement said the appointment was effective July 15.

Dr. Schaefer has served since 1962 as director of the University of California's Institute of Marine Resources (IMR), whose headquarters are located on the campus of Scripps Institution of Oceanography, a branch of the University of California, San Diego.

Between 1951 and 1963 he was director of investigations for the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission and he has served as IATTC scientific consultant since 1963.

Dr. Schaefer, who joined Scripps Institution in 1951, succeeds Dr. Thomas F. Bates, who is returning to Pennsylvania State University to be vice-president for planning, after two years as Udall's science adviser.

Dr. Henry W. Menard, who joined the Scripps faculty in 1955 as associate professor of geology and as an IMR staff member, has been named acting director of IMR during Dr. Schaefer's absence on leave. His appointment was announced by Acting UC President Harry R. Wellman and UCSD Chancellor John S. Galbraith.

Dr. Menard was appointed full professor at Scripps in 1961. During 1965-66, he was on leave of absence in Washington as technical assistant in oceanography for the White House Office of Science and Technology. His chief field of study at Scripps has been the sea floor, especially that of the Pacific Ocean.
