

Auction of "found and unclaimed" property

The public auction of "found and unclaimed" property at the University of California, San Diego is the place to get it.

The Materiel Management Department at UCSD will conduct a public auction beginning at 10:00 a.m. Saturday, March 18, on the loading dock of the Receiving Division, Building 509, Matthews Campus. All items to be auctioned will be available for inspection beginning at 8:30 a.m.

According to Ralph W. Roblee, inventory manager, among the unclaimed property to be sold are bicycles, books, slide rules, eye glasses, assorted watches and jewelry, clothing, surfboards, a number of miscellaneous items, and one brand new tricycle. In addition, several televisions, adding machines, and typewriters, listed as excess University property, will also be auctioned.

According to the law, all unclaimed property must be held by the campus police department and then disposed of by public auction. All sales must be for cash only.
