

30 University of Baja California visit SIO

Some 30 students from the Escuela Superior de Ciencias Marinas, University of Baja California, Ensenada, along with faculty members and their wives, will visit the University of California, San Diego's Scripps Institution of Oceanography on Thursday, May 28.

This visit continues the semi-annual People-to-People exchange program between students of the Ensenada school and UCSD which began in 1961. The People-to-People committee responsible for the arrangements is sponsored by the Oceanids, a UCSD women's group.

Greeting the visitors when they arrive at the Vaughan Aquarium-Museum on the campus will be Scripps' assistant director, Jeffery D. Frautschy, and committee members, Mmes. James Arnold, John Isaacs, Kurt Shuler, and John Weir, and Miss Martha Capin.

The Ensenada students and faculty will attend a briefing session in Sumner Auditorium in the morning and will be served an informal sack lunch at noon, at which time they will be joined by members of the committee and Scripps faculty and students.

During the afternoon, Frautschy will escort the group through the hydraulics laboratory, fish and plankton collections, geological core collection, and the Scripps library.

Faculty wives will spend the day with members of the committee on a shopping and sightseeing tour of San Diego.

A soccer game between the Ensenada and UCSD students will be played at 4:00 p.m. on the UCSD soccer field to conclude the day's activities.

Chairman of the Oceanids' People-to-People committee is Mrs. Arnold. Mrs. Thomas Price will supervise luncheon arrangements. Mmes. William McGuire and William Van Dorn are responsible for the shopping and sightseeing.
