A Buddhist priest, the Rev. Tetsuo Unno, will speak on "Religion in This Postmodern World," at noon, Friday, April 21, in Room 111A, Chancellor's Complex, University Center. This free lecture is part of the UCSD Humanities Lecture Series, and is open to the public.

The Rev. Unno was reared in Japan. He was educated in the United States and Japan, receiving a bachelor's degree at the University of California, Berkeley, and two master's degrees in Buddhism, which were earned at Ryukoku University, Kyoto, and Tokyo University. He studied for his doctoral degree in Buddhism at UCLA, where he is a teacher and research assistant.

Lecture venues have included Pasadena City College Religious Studies; Cal State University, Department of Philosophy; and UCLA's Religious Conference on Buddhism.
