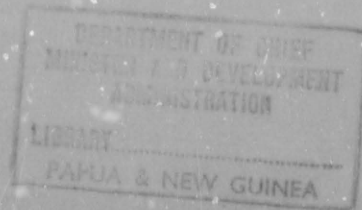

Patrol Report No. 2 1973/74 - Saidor.

Attached please find three copies of the above patrol report. The object of the patrol was to contact and census the people of Pesangana and Ngagnep. Once again Mr. Spencer has produced a document of a commendable standard.

I have the following comments to make on the report.

1. INTRODUCTION: It is very good to see that Mr. Spencer spent so much time with these small groups of people attempting to find out how much they knew and also imparted his knowledge of the Local Government System and National Development and the workings of the House of Assembly. The use of Sgt. Amusa to explain the laws of the land was a very sensible attitude.
2. COUNCIL - GENERAL It amazes me that these people have not been contacted before, as they live in fairly close proximity to the coast. It is hard to imagine that people such as these two groups still exist in this Sub District. The people are quite obviously interested in helping themselves which is good sign.

The Council is not interested in asking these people to pay tax as it fully appreciates that they are unable to do so, and I feel that this situation will remain so for some time to come. The Council must consider amending its Constitution to ensure that these people are included and further the Council tax Rule be amended to state that these people are not liable to pay tax.

- 3. PEOPLE AND THE ECONOMY: It is hoped to increase planting of coffee in the area to give the people a chance of getting some cash in the future. It is quite obvious that Ngagnep is ideally situated in that it is free from drought. The obvious aim is now to get the Pesangana's to become more closely knit society.

The problem of wild pigs appears to be quite serious and I feel that the next patrol in the area should be adequately armed with rifles to destroy all these beasts, should the people want them killed off.


- 4. EDUCATION: It is a pity to find the people being taught the Kote language. Pidgin English will certainly be the official lingua franca of this country. In the Nankina area we have the problem with Kote, as a lot of people speak it, but do not speak Pidgin English. I think the whole attitude of the Missions towards languages, is out of context in this day and age.

The people were brought to Saider for a four day trip and enjoyed themselves immensely. The O.I.C. D.A.S.F. is to be congratulated on giving up much of his time to ensure that the people saw the economical progress.

- 5. Health: It is encouraging to see that the people are free from any serious illnesses. It is a pity that contact with the outside people, will cause diseases to be spread in the area.

The incident referred to in respect of A.P.O. at Mangak has been attended to, by my writing to the District Health Officer. I am awaiting his decision in the matter.

- 6. GENERAL: The proposed establishment of a school at Sel is in the hands of the Council, who are dealing direct with the Department of Education. It is hoped that a water system for Sel village will be finished within the year, that is if the Council has sufficient funds.

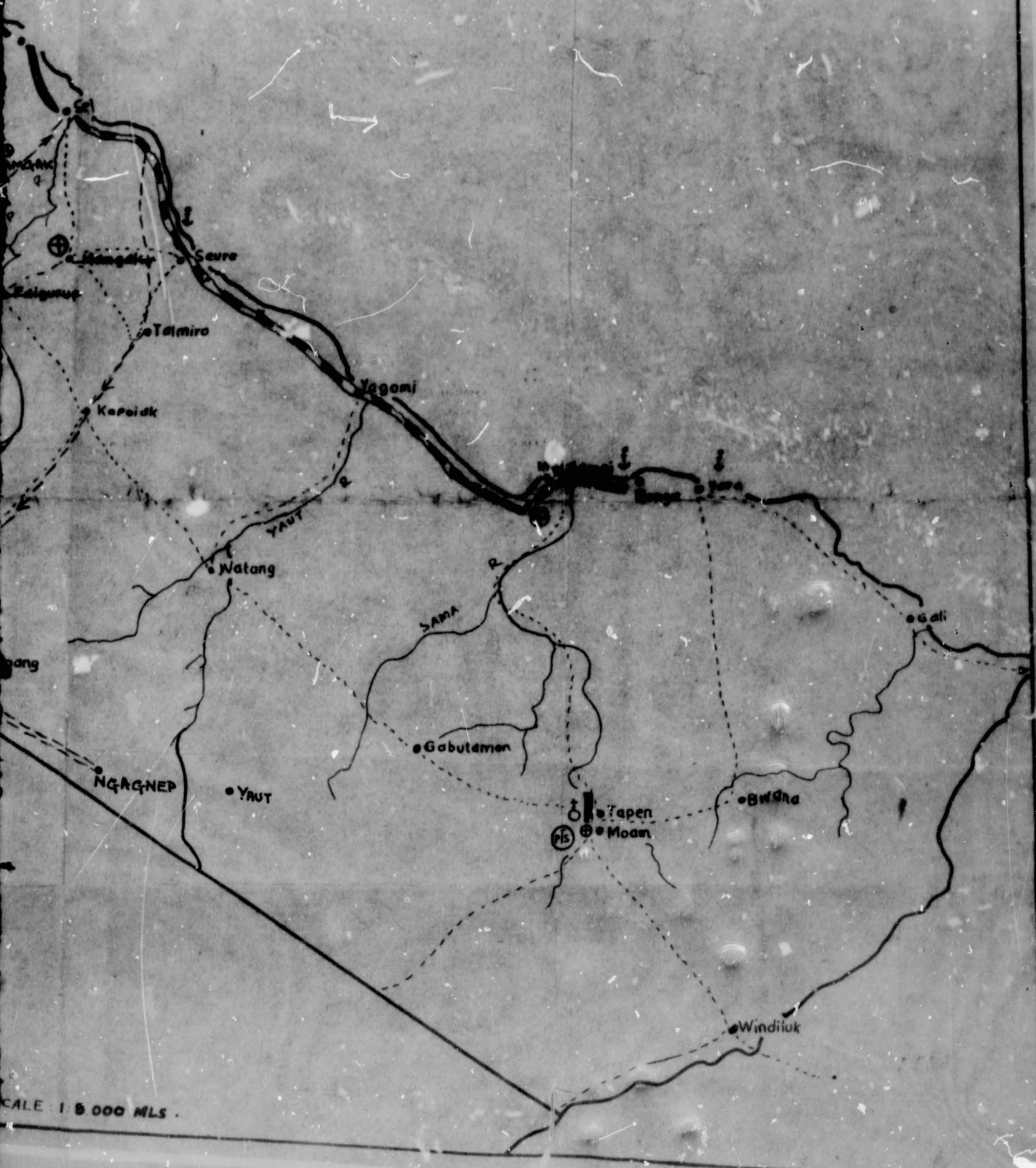

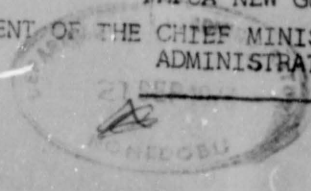

Enclosed please find two copies of the above patrol  
report prepared by Mr. Rorosi, A.P.O. The object of  
this patrol was to survey the boundaries of the Teptep  
Base Camp.

I have the following comments to make on his patrol  
report.

A reasonably well prepared report by a very junior  
officer. I asked for a patrol report to be done by  
this officer as I feel that it is in line with his  
training, and it appears to have been a worthwhile  
exercise.

In respect of the surveyed land, a land report investigation  
will be prepared next week by Mr. Giru, O.L.C. Teptep.  
I myself, hope to visit Teptep and investigate the  
houses which are already built on the land. I know for  
a fact that the 10 village houses will be removed by  
the people as they are quite happy to assist the  
Government in establishment of the station. Construction  
has already commenced on these 10 houses. The 4 houses  
belonging to the Lutheran Mission will be removed as  
agreed earlier this year, with the Missionary in charge  
at Tapen.

The matter of carriers mentioned in the second last  
paragraph of this report, has been attended to. The  
people of Tapen village have been reluctant to carry

for all patrols except C.D.A. in the past. The dispute has now been settled, and was caused by some ill feeling, caused by the Malaria Survey Team a few months ago.

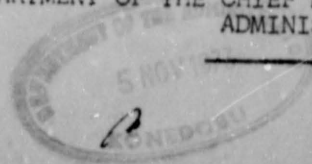

My observations are:

In regard to D.A.S.F. Patrolling, you are reminded of my circular 6-1-1 of 11th April, 1973, setting out current D.A.S.F. policy in the matter. Please ensure that this is understood by officers in the Sub-District. I shall, however, advise the D.R.D.O. of the interest of the inland MOI people in agricultural development, and he may be able to arrange for an R.D.O. to visit the area.

Taxation policy will be a matter for a policy decision, by the national government. Our concern is to explain policies which have been decided upon, and to foster the objectives of the government, such as the Right Point Programme.

The suggestion of polythene, or plastic, piping to replace brittle bamboo water supply lines seems an excellent proposal to me, for the R.I.P. programme. Other suggestions for economic development are worthy of consideration, although I agree that all will not be feasible.

"Situation Reports" Nos. 4 and 6 are essentially of local interest only, and have been amended to form part of the Patrol Report. Those dealing with economic development may be of interest to M.Q., and have been sent on.

An interesting report of a useful patrol. Changes in the Area Study seem not substantial, although the steady road development is recognised.

I have very little to say in respect of the patrol report which is brief of necessity.


It is quite true that R.D.O. have not visited the Mot Census Division for some considerable time, and the people of the whole area have requested on numerous occasions that an Officer of the Department of Agricultural Stock and Fisheries visit them. This is more so applicable in respect of the inland areas which are not on roads.

The people were told about the Area Authority last year, and the Council was handed pidgin circulars explaining this body. This is a typical reaction by people when they have 'forgotten' anything they have been told.

I do not agree that income tax could be imposed on these people at the present time, however, I do feel that it may be essential in the future, to impose a production tax on the amount produced by the individual.

The matter of water retirculation will be mentioned to the Rai Coast Council, as it is preparing its submission for Rural Improvement Programme funds 1974/75.



Attached please find the above patrol report conducted by Mr. Urban Gira of Teptep.


Once again we have a very good report from a young officer who is proving beyond doubt that he has the interests of the people of his area, very much at heart.

These people have been neglected over the years and now as they face impending nationhood, they require the services of an officers such as Mr. Gira.

There is rather a heavy concentration of population at Keviang, there being over 300 people resident there. Although it may seem to be rather close to Teptep I feel that at the present time it is best it should remain where it is.

It is the intention of the Public Health to post a Health Extension Officer at Teptep, and I would suggest that this officer be asked to carry out surveys of locations of all aidposts in the area. At the present time we are finding it difficult to obtain staff in the field of health, and I can see that the Department of Public Health will be willing to set up an aidpost at Wandabong at present.

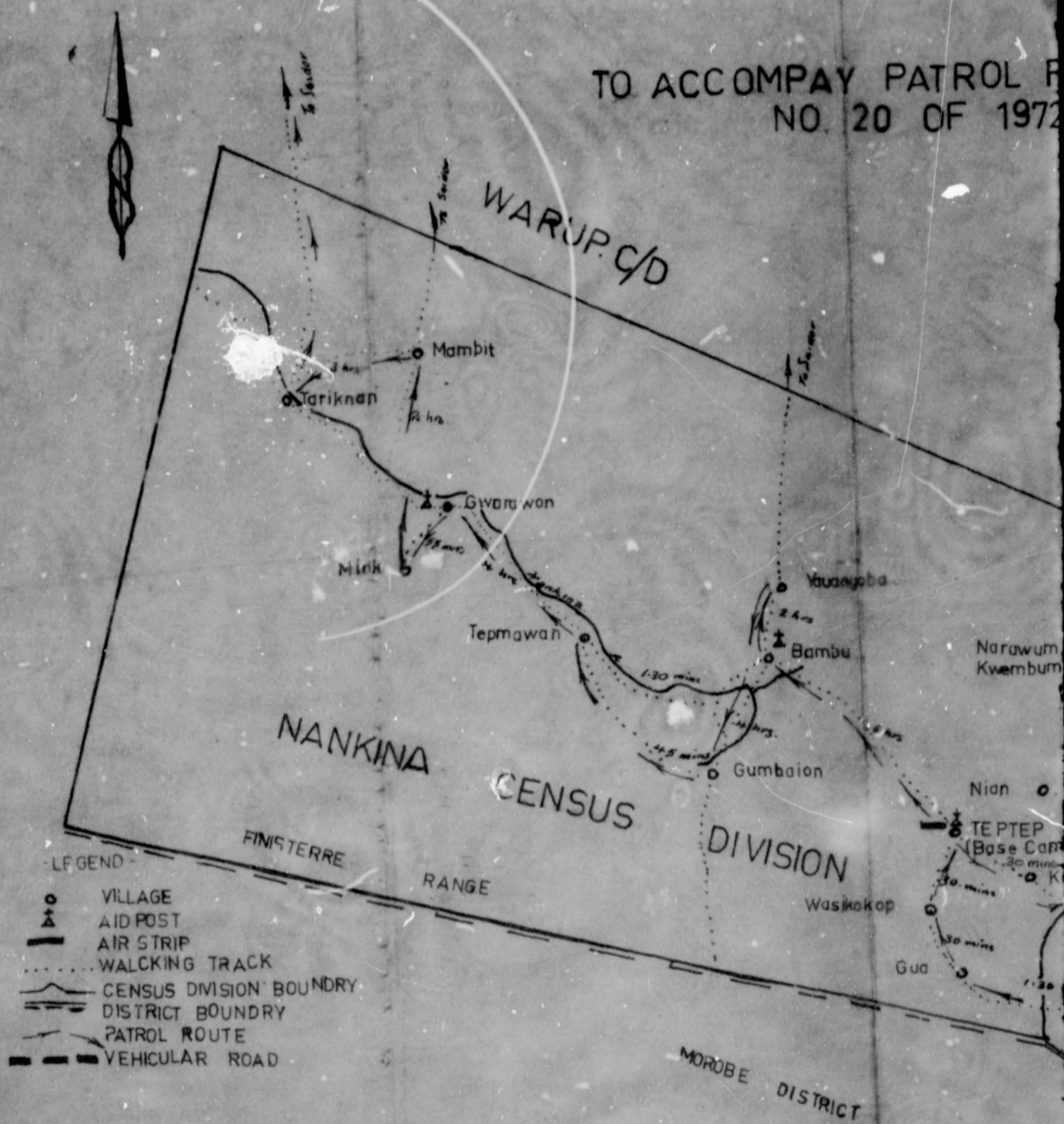

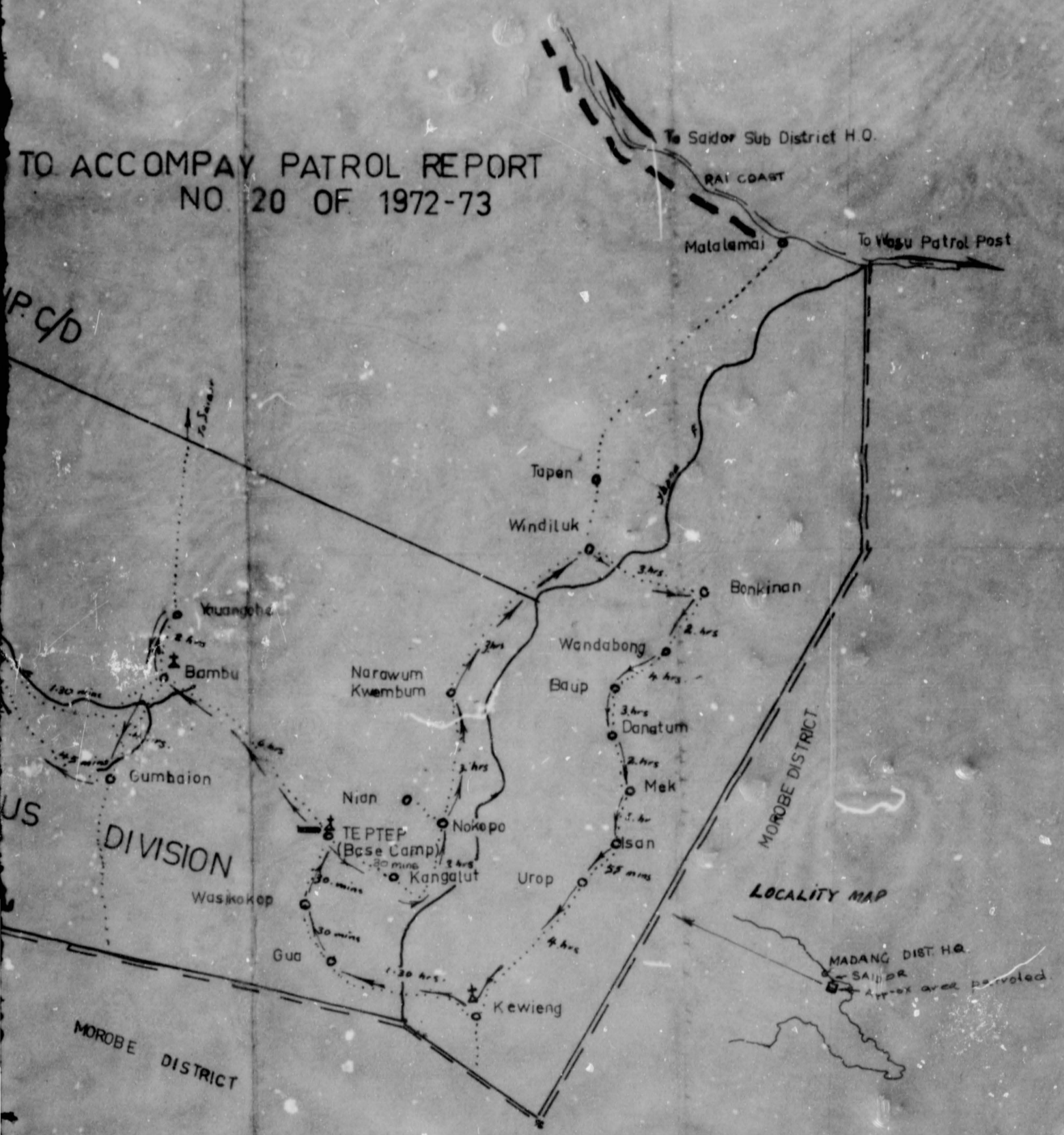



My observations are:

Once again, a comprehensive and interesting report from Mr. Spencer. Your comprehensive patrol instructions are also commended.

It would seem that many of the inland people are groping for suitable avenues of development and this is leading some, including Councillors, away from their home areas towards the coast. Certainly, I would agree that Councillors have a duty to attend to affairs in their home areas, but perhaps it would be unfair to expect them to eschew economic opportunities.

I think you will now be aware that D.A.S.F. are again promoting coffee planting, and this may be a useful crop for these inland areas. Cattle raising should also be encouraged.

The question of European vegetable production in the District is to be re-examined, following a D.C.C. discussion this week. One cause of produce deteriorating is poor packing for movement: "bilums" are scarcely suitable for most such produce, and some cheap alternative, such as small bamboo crates, needs to be devised.

As the word is rather recurrent in these reports, would Mr. Spencer please note that bridges have sites, not sights.

A competently performed patrol. Situation reports will be referred to interested departments, etc. Those numbered 1, 4 and 5, have been re-headed as appendices to the Patrol Report, Nos. 1, 2 and 3 respectively. Please note for your records.

Patrol Report Number 8 of 1973/74 - Saidor.

Attached please find Mr. J.B. Spencer's report of a patrol into the Yaganon Census Division. Also attached are nine Situation Reports. The tenth one having been already forwarded to you under confidential cover.

My comments on the patrol report are as follows:

Council and General.

It has become far too common for Councillors to reside on the coastal fringe and leave their people at home in the mountains. These seven Councillors who were absent during Mr. Spencers visit, all claim that they were busily engaged in economic activities. This would be so for four of them, however, the other three are known to be lazy inefficient units.

As Mr. Spencer has pointed out it is quite common for men to leave villages and visit the coast. There seems to be no cure for this problem except possibly the introduction of some economic enterprises other than coffee.

The complaint by the people of Meibu that they have too much to undertake, should be taken with a pinch of salt. They could quite easily have their near neighbours assist them, and it is only a matter of diplomacy for the leaders to get villagers in to help construct the various projects which need to be undertaken.

The problem mentioned in the last paragraph of this heading will be investigated by this office.

That these projects will be successful, due to the interest taken by the officers of the  
Agriculture.

Economy - Shipping.

It appears that this boat has in part been obtained by what appears to be a fools paradise. The people of Lamtub originally ordered the boat, however the Councillor from Sarakiri, Rongona by name, has got himself involved in the purchase of the boat. Rongona is a most unstable and conniving person. He has unrealistic ideals and his boating venture is the latest. He has lead us to believe in a recent interview that he now owes the Development Bank, \$1,200. It seems strange that the Bank are so willing to give him a loan, without first having it thoroughly investigated by this office. I am most disturbed that the money will not be repaid to the Bank as Rongona is deeply in debt, within his own community and innumerable people are now attempting to have him liquidate his debts, he is not capable of doing this.

Cattle:

It can be seen that Rongona is not satisfactorily looking after the cattle which he obtained in the past. Rongona has been ordered to fence in all his cattle within the foreseeable future. Failure to carry out these instructions will make him liable for prosecution under the Councils cattle Rule.

Coffee and Copra:

I have no comment on this topic.

Business - General and Orientation.

It is indeed true that no ready market is available for European vegetables, cabbages, onions etc. do not carry well. Recently we had experience of cabbages which arrived here at Saidor 48 hours after they were picked, and they were rotten.

I agree with Mr. Spencer, that the most important influence to business development as a whole will be the success of the four cattle projects. I feel that these projects will be successful, due to the interest taken by the officers of the Department of Agriculture.

I have nothing to say by way of comment on this heading.

Health:

It is believed five children died of influenza at Orinma since this patrol returned, however, it appears that the disease has been contained.

General:

The construction of a suspension bridge in the Upper Yaganon will be carried out by the Council. The construction of a bridge across the Yandar river will be looked into thoroughly by the Local Government Engineer when he visits Saidor this month.

Once again we have a patrol report of very high standard from Mr. Spencer.

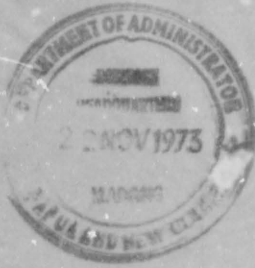

Saidor Patrol Report 10 of 1973/74

Enclosed herewith please find one copy of the above patrol report, and also a jacket for Headquarters.

My comments on the patrol report are as follows:

- 1). Mr. Spencer gave some able assistance to the Japanese War Graves Commission, and they have already expressed their satisfaction with his work.

It was essential to send Mr. Spencer to Teptep with the Japanese as they could not speak English. One of them could speak a type of broken English/Pidgin English. They were very happy with their work at Teptep.

- 2). The holding of Council meetings in the bush has a lot of good points, and I am happy to see the Rai Coast Council getting out amongst the people and showing them exactly how the Council meeting operates.

The comments on Councillor Dou have been noted, and I have already communicated with this gentleman and pointed out to him the errors of his ways. He agrees that he has been a little lax in his duties of Port Folio Councillor for Agriculture, and assures me that he will do all in his power to rectify his rather blatant disregard of his duties.

It is a pity to see Councillors leaving their inland villages and moving to the coast, however, it is in the interest of the economic development of the Rai Coast and therefore I feel that the only solution to the problem is for the people to elect new Councillors at the next General Election of the Council.

- 3). The work carried out on the Lamtub/Yalau road by the people has been very heartening, and it is now possible to drive a vehicle to the Yaganon river. This seems a considerable feat, when one considers that work commenced in June of this year and also one must take into consideration the fact that the population of the area is very sparse.

The bridge site over the Yaganon river looks to be good, however, the construction of a bridge will be rather expensive. I have been lead to believe, as recently as yesterday, that the Local Government Engineer is giving consideration to the construction of a causeway across this river. I regret that I cannot agree with this, as a causeway on Rai Coast have been failures or near failures. The Mot Causeway is a fine example of the unsuitability of causeways across large rivers. I personally have not seen the Mot river causeway for approximately 9 months, as it has been covered by water the whole time. This has been caused by the pipes under the causeway being blocked up with gravel. We cannot clear them due to the extreme flows of water coming over the causeway.

I feel that a simple four strand wire suspension bridge across the Yaganon for foot traffic would be ideal, and I will be asking the Council to give consideration to including a foot bridge in their estimates in the 1974/75 financial year.

- 4). Meibu airstrip has been the subject of quite a fair amount of correspondence in the last two months. The District Airport Inspectors' report has been received and to this end I am sending Mr. Hocknull on patrol to this area this week to assist the people in carrying out the requirements as laid down by the District Airport Inspector.
- 5). The Singor Sorang road is a typical example of self help by the people of the Rai Coast. This



is a remarkable achievement considering the population in the area is very small, and the people have shown a willingness to construct this road into their area, thus enabling a vehicle to assist with the transport of rice and coffee to the coast. This road also opens up the large area of kunai grasslands ~~which is~~ suitable for the raising of cattle. I have requested the R.D.O. Saidot to investigate the feasibility of starting projects in this area.

- 6). I concur with Mr. Spencer's statements on the supply of building materials. Numerous letters have been despatched to Companies requesting that they fulfil the orders, and it appears that we should receive the majority of items later this month. I think that store owners should be contacted and reminded of the importance of supplying building materials to Councils, as the majority of these buildings are being constructed with R.I.P. funds. They should also be reminded that the Chief Minister is very keen to improve the 'lot' of the rural sector of the population of this country.
- 7). I feel that the distribution of coffee pulpers by the Council has definitely resulted in an increase of coffee production. It is hoped that all villages will have coffee pulpers, supplied by the Council, within the next two years.
- 8). The establishment of a school at Ganglau is not recommended at the present time, due to the sufficient lack of numbers of children of school age.

Once again we have a patrol report of a high standard from Mr. Spencer, and he is to be commended for his thoroughness in which he carries out his reports.



My observations are:

For various reasons, lengthy delay has occurred in handling of Patrol Reports, which is regretted.

The report appears to have been capably conducted, and much useful work done. Except for S/R No. 9 and 10 (b) the Situation Reports, while containing such useful information of District interest, do not really fall into the category of reports now required at H.P. and they have accordingly been treated as appendices of the Patrol Report. Separate pages for the various topics does have advantages for filing and reference to other Departments etc. as may be required.

Brief comments on matters raised follows:

- (1) BONEDOU's boat: This has been raised in separate correspondence. Should he be accepting passengers as fares on the boat, some regulatory action should be possible.
- (2) MEIBU Airstrip: Copies of the report have been furnished to the D.A.I. & P.W.D. Perhaps you could arrange for a further inspection and report in due course, covering the drainage work which was to have been completed after patrol's departure.
- (3) MEIBU to Coas Road: It appears to be clear that this proposal is not feasible. Your advice that a stock route does exist is noted, and it is hoped that D.A.S.F. will survey cattle-raising prospects in the area.
- (4) AID POST - SCHOOL: It is suggested that the difference of opinion with Cy Isang on the re-location of these facilities should be discussed privately with other Councillors, especially with members of the Finance/Executive Committee. They may perhaps be able to "bring him around" to the change.

- (5) DIMAN & BUDAMU: Report referred to D.L.G.O. for his information, in view of possible ward changes.
- (6) LAND DEVELOPMENT: Coastal people should be discreetly encouraged to make surplus land available for inland groups who wish to undertake plantings, etc.
- (7) CATTLE PROJECTS: It is not clear what orders were given, nor authority for these. However, I am inclined to agree that neglected cattle should be confiscated by the Development Bank (if it has such authority) if advice and warnings are ignored.
- (8) EIGHT-POINT PLAN: Agricultural development. This proposal is dealt with as "Situation Report".
- (9) UNREST AT YALAU. Your other reports on this matter were discussed with Police and certain action was taken at the time. I agree with your remarks on this matter, and the question of the shotgun registration will be taken up with Police.
- (10) YALAU PLANTATION - POSSIBLE SALE. The D.R.D.O. has been asked to examine this proposal. Perhaps it would be better for local groups near Yalau to be given the chance of purchasing, provided they can raise enough equity.

My observations are:

Unfortunately this Patrol Report consisted almost entirely of Situation Reports, when each of the subjects so dealt with, should more properly have been included in the body of the Patrol Report. I have therefore dealt with them as part of the Patrol Report, and have the following comments:-

1. MELIBU Airstrip: I agree with your comments.
2. Road - Coast to MELIBU: If the road is not feasible, then the people would be well advised to concentrate on the construction of the Airstrip.
3. Resiting of Aid Post & School: The relocations would seem to be a matter of common sense. I assume that the Dist. Educ. Board has approved the resiting of the school at GUTU.
4. People of DEMAN & BIDAMU: Councillor Ipang seems to develop overbearing attitudes and illusions of grandeur where his constituents are concerned. The two small groups are of course at liberty to settle where they wish, within the framework of their existing tribal landholdings.
5. Land Titles Commission: Wrongly titled, but I agree with the dissemination of information by Field Officers is an important aspect of their work.
6. Cattle Projects: There has been some considerable delay in the processing of this report, due to it being wrongly forwarded to D.O.C.H. & D.A. I/Q. Would you please advise of the present position regarding this obviously improperly managed project?
- 7/8 Coffee Production: It is good to see that plantings of this cash crop are expanding. I think that Mr. Hocknell may be confused about Mission Air freight charges. Certainly in other areas the price paid for coffee on the smaller Mission airstrips is substantially less than that being paid at Madang. However this is not a major point. The few aircraft needed to service the stores would be inadequate to backload any but a tiny fraction of the coffee produced. Any other aircraft would of course require the payment of the full air freight component. Situation Reports 10a and 10b are being dealt with as separate correspondence.

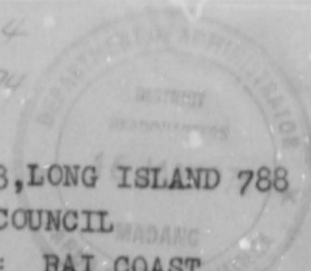

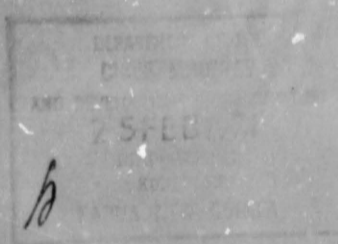

Once again, an impressive list of R.I.P. Projects in this census division, and the fact that most have been completed, or are on the verge of being so, is a reflection of the hard work which has been carried out by the field staff at SAIDOR. Materials however, have caused some hold-ups, but this is general throughout the District.

The dissent over the extension and upgrading of the TAPEN airstrip continues. For Mission airstrips of this nature, I do not think that Dept. of Transport permission to construct the strip is needed. Once it has been built as a private landing field, an inspection by D.C.A. prior to its opening is all that is needed. If the finance is available and supervision from Mission sources is forthcoming, it would be better to sit back and wait for results. Particularly if the Local people support the project.



This Situation Report is quite large and has some quite good ideas in it.

Taking firstly the Rice factory, I feel that it is unrealistic to have a rice factory here at Saidor at the present time, however, threshing machines etc., would be a terrific advantage to our area once we have somewhere in the vicinity of 1,000 to 2,000 acres in rice. We are all aware of the proposal for a rice factory to commence operations in Madang in the coming years.

The amount of coffee production in the area is not large, the maximum production would be in the vicinity of 100 tons, however, we are only pulling out about 25% of this 100 tons. I agree that the people are concerned about the cost of instant coffee, however, they could roast their coffee and grind it, and make quite an acceptable cup of coffee, as has been proved by one gentleman at Umboldi village. One must remember, that from the time coffee is picked until it arrives back here in Saidor as instant coffee, it probably passes through at least six middlemen.

The idea of a vegetable factory here at Saidor, is sound, if, 1) we could get the people to plant large areas of vegetables suitable for canning, or cooling and, 2) that we could get a company interested in establishing the industry. At the present time, the Rai Coast Council is in the process of handing out vegetable seeds to the populus at large. This programme is aimed, 1) improving the peoples diet, 2) allowing the supplies to be sold here at Saidor and also in Madang. Once the seed has been distributed and the people become engaged in the production of fresh vegetables, then, and only then, do I think we will be able to gauge whether or not this is an acceptable industry to the people.

To deal with the points as raised by Mr. Hodgkiss:-

- (1) Rice factory - a good idea, but requires an enormous acreage and intensive mechanization to support a full scale mill. This would not be available at SAIBOR in the near future.
- (2) Coffee factory - Communications appear to be the problem here. No point in large scale investment of this kind until a large acreage is accessible to factory site by road.
- (3) Vegetable factory - see above.
- (4) Spices have a limited market and this is delicately balanced. Many spices take long periods to mature and production of "vast quantities" would completely upset the present prices. Also it is not so simple to produce these commodities as Mr. Hodgkiss is lead to believe.
- (5) The Jant project in Madang is assessing the utilisation of mixed lowland forests. There are many drawbacks to a similar project in the RAI Coast area - (Road access, narrow Coastal plain etc.)
- (6) This transgresses present Govt. Policy, and I thoroughly support the present controls. This could not become a major RAI Coast industry even if the controls were lifted.
- (7) Sugar - see 2 & 3
- (8) Other points are dealt with by A.B.C.'s comments.

The idea of a spice industry has always appealed to me. However, it would appear that Indonesia and like countries have a stranglehold on the spice industry. I believe that companies will not buy less than 1 ton of pepper, for instance, from any one grower or group of growers. Experiments are being carried out throughout the country in the growing of spices, and we will have to wait the results of these tests.

Timber industry: I agree that we have adequate supplies of timber here to commence a timber industry, but once again it is getting a company interested, and there are problems of transporting the timber out of the area, due to the fact that good anchorages are few and far between. I do believe that the Department of Forests has done a survey of the area and at the present time they are not really interested in initiating any concrete proposals for the establishment of mills etc. They are concentrating on the Gogol timber scheme, which at the present time appears to be an area with fantastic potential.

The movement of bird life and wildlife to foreign countries, is I feel, an excellent idea, however, we would find it difficult to catch sufficient beasts and birds to export. There would then be problems of quarantine etc., also the Government policy at the moment appears to be one of stringent ecological preference, and this of course institutes the preservation of as much birdlife as possible.

The idea of a sugar industry to be started on the Rai Coast, appeals to me, however, once again it appears that the Markham Valley is the place which has been selected, due to its large areas of unused flat lands. Surely there is some simple way of extracting sugar from cane so that individuals on the Rai Coast could be set up his own little industry. The suggestion that the juice he extracted from the cane is not very good, because we are well aware, sugar cane goes into a factory and no waste product comes out of the otherend, due to the fact that sugar is extracted, rum distilled and the skin of the plant is used for the manufacture of cane board etc.

The other requests as dealt with by Mr. Hocknull are ones that are coming up continually. The Council has request funds for a permanent materials school to be built at Tapen in 1974/75. A letter has already been written to the Department of Education requesting a school at Sel in 1974/75. Improvements of inland vehicular roads are under way where the people are willing to work. The matter of the dormitory facilities for the children at Umboldi will be investigated and it will be pointed out to the parents that it will be their responsibility to care for the children and feed them.

I am afraid that an airstrip at Tapen is to me, a complete and utter waste of time, as this village is only three hours easy walk from the coast.

Mr. Hocknull has done the right thing in informing the Mission that he must approach me so that I can approach my District Commissioner. I feel that \$17,000 made available by the branch of the Lutheran Mission in Germany would be better used on the proposed Gwawaren airstrip or the Guhu (Meibu) airstrip, which is at present under construction.

The majority of villages in the Wavp Census Division are between sea level and 3,000 ft. Therefore the below listed ideas for economic development cover both coastal and inland villages.

**RICE FACTORY.**

A mill to be established in the Subdistrict therefore a better price would be gained for these products, by cutting down on freight costs and sale to plantation stores, and used by Government Departments for rations.

**COFFEE FACTORY.**

Establishment of a small processing plant for coffee in the Subdistrict to cater for local demand in the District, and some export. These people are quite aware that they pay 50¢ for 2 oz of instant coffee and only receive 18¢ to 20¢ per lb for beans. They are perturbed about the vast difference between prices received and how much must be spent to rebuy that one pound.

**VEGETABLE FACTORY.**

The inland people maintain that if they received good prices for European type vegetables, they would produce these in great abundance giving a cash income for their women folk, but because of delays in freighting such produce to market in Madang it is impractical.

If a processing plant or cooler facilities were available they could see that their crop and time, is not being wasted.

**SPICE INDUSTRY.**

A University Student on holiday broached this subject at a meeting and said that one of the main reasons the white man came to Papua New Guinea

was in search of new and established spices. This being the case, then why not now, in a time of vast technological improvements in marketing and processing, do we not produce vast quantities of high quality spices. With the ground and weather conditions at our disposal Papua New Guinea could lead the world in spice production and even establish its' own brand of spices hitherto undeveloped."

These words of enlightenment encouraged the people no end, to ask questions and the presence of two D.A.S.F. Officers was a definite asset.

The young man concerned is studying Business Development and Management and has promised to forward to D.A.S.F. and Rai Coast Local Government Council, any information he can glean from Lae University and Business Development, Madang on the subject.

#### TIMBER INDUSTRY.

A member of the R.P.N.G.C. was also on leave, at the time of this patrol, from Manus, and he broached the subject of a timber industry in the Subdistrict. He maintained if Manus can do it, so can Saider and apart from that vast areas of coastal land could be cleared by machinery for development of rice and cattle industries.

With the sale of the timber, tractors and ploughs could be bought on a communal basis and a man employed fulltime moving up and down the coast tilling ground for rice planting. The delta areas of the Yupna, Yaut and Warup would facilitate approximately 25,000 hectares and the area around the Urawa Delta in the Morobe District, another 20,000 hectares.

#### EXPORT OF WILDLIFE TO FOREIGN ZOOS.

This subject mainly referred to the bird life. These people have vast areas of land, still virgin bush, as is with most areas in the Saider Subdistrict, and they could see no reason why a stringent control on the export of birdlife, such as members of the parrot, cockatoo, hornbill and some bird of prey families, could not be introduced.

Other creatures such as fruit bats bandicoots, possum and some snakes could be caught for sale to collectors or a Government Agency.

These are the people's ideas expanded upon by myself.

SUGAR INDUSTRY.

The people of the Tapen area indicated a desire for a sugar industry to be set up to give the people of further inland a cash crop other than coffee. If a processing plant were available on the coast the people could prepare the sugar, i.e. extract the juice in the village and carry the liquid to the processing plant, instead of the sticks of sugar, thereby making a load of liquid more profitable than a large heavy load of mostly surplus and waste materials.

Other requests from individual areas were :-

- 1). A permanent material school at Tapen.

It is understood that a submission has been put forward for R.I.P. funds for 1974/75 .

- 2). A primary School at Sel or Seure Villages, to cater for the coastal and inland villages in that area.

A Primary School at Seure would facilitate at least nine villages and the Children from Malalamai, Bunga and Yara Villages could walk 2 to 3 hours along the coast, rather than 5 to 6 hours uphill to Tapen. The type of school that is at Umboldi at present could be implemented at Seure.

- 3). Improvements in all vehicular roads going inland.

It was explained that all vehicular roads in the Subdistrict were the responsibility of the people to maintain and if they wished to extend the roads they should approach the Council.

- 4). The building of a road from the coast to Mangak.

A road inland from Sel up to Mangak would enable a coffee storage shed to be built and therefore a central buying point for the people of the Mankina Census Division, and to enable road transport for Copra, coffee, and vegetables to be taken to market.

- 5). A larger school at Umboldi with dormitory facilities for the children from further afield.

At present Umboldi operates on a 2 class system. Standards 1 and 4 one year, 2 and 5 the next, and Preparatory 3 and 6 the next. The people further inland tend to miss out on sending their children to preparatory classes as when enrolment is required, the villages closer to the school fill the places. These inland people maintain that if a larger school were built and a dormitory available, then



their children would have equal opportunity in their education.

- 6). A D.C.A. approved commercial airstrip at Tapan.

Whilst the patrol was at Tapan the subject of the Tapan airstrip was raised. A Pastor Wolfgang Baessler of Kabwun was attending a Lutheran Mission meeting and informed the patrol that \$17,000 was available from a German Agency for the building of the airstrip. He asked if the Government would give moral backing to this project and upon completion, if the Council would be interested in taking over the maintenance. I informed Mr. Baessler that I shall put what was discussed in my report, but might be more appropriate if all relevant details and Lutheran Mission policy be sent to my A.D.C. for his information and onforwarding to Headquarters, rather than by word of mouth.

It is my opinion that the money would be better spent at Guhu and Gwarawon where more people would benefit. Also if the Lutheran Mission moved their circuit Headquarters to Teptey a greater population would have better contact with their 'Spiritual leaders'.

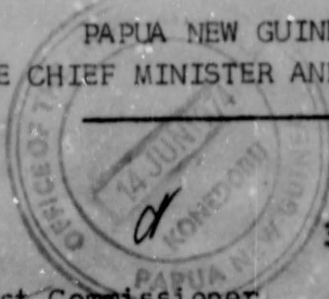

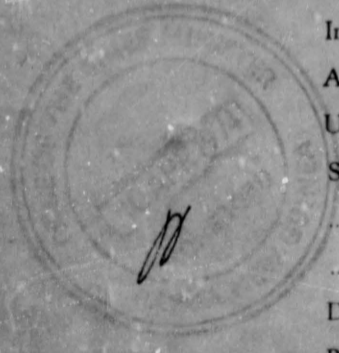

L. THE STAGE OF POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT.

These people, due to the fact that they have a considerable number of wirelesses are very much au fait with the present situation in Papua New Guinea, more particularly the political situation. I would say that their knowledge of politics is far better than that of their coastal brothers in the Rai Coast Council area. It is not uncommon to arrive in a village during the day to find the wireless on, and people sitting around listening to the news etc.

More patrols of a political education nature will be carried out on Long Island during this year.

M. ECONOMY OF THE AREA.

The people of Long Island are now being encouraged to produce more copra and also to plant out more groves of coconuts.

I see the establishment of a Co-operative as one of the possible ways of expanding the economy, however, there was a Co-operative on Long Island in the past, which collapsed due, I am lead to believe, to lack of supervision, and thereby the resultant lack of interest from the people.

The people do export a large number of beetlenut to Madang on the Koro, however, I think that most of this goes as gifts and not for resale.

N. POSSIBILITIES OF EXPANDING THE ECONOMY.

I do see the distinct possibility of expanding the economy, if copra productions were enlarged and also if the people were encouraged to plant more beetlenut for resale.

There may be a future in the production of turtles on a commercial basis on Long Island, however, this would have to be looked into first.



The object of this patrol was to supervise the construction of the road from Maibang in the direction of Lusuang. Four days were spent in supervisory work along with A.P.O. J. Banzak.

The people of Maibang and Lusuang have shown a great willingness to clear the road from Maibang to Lusuang which is approximately 12 miles in length.

At the time of writing this area has been cleared completely and earthworks have now commenced.

The people are giving their services voluntarily in a rotation basis. Groups of villages in the upper Mot Census Division are working a rotation basis, one week work on the road and two weeks off.

At the present time it appears that this road is quite feasible and will open up a large coffee growing area. There is a potential for cattle raising also along the length of this road. The people are keen to get the road through, as they feel once Lusuang is reached, the road can proceed on to Matoko. Should this be achieved, it will open up large areas of land and give the people easy access to the coast. It will also allow the opening of a school at Matoko in years to come, as already this villages have sufficient children to commence a primary school.

During the course of this patrol the people were given talks by Mr. Banzak on Political Education topics, these talks were given at lunch break and after dinner at night.

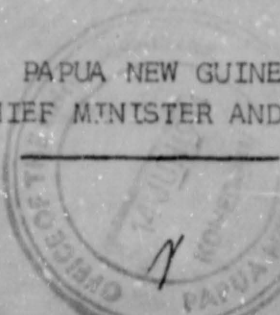

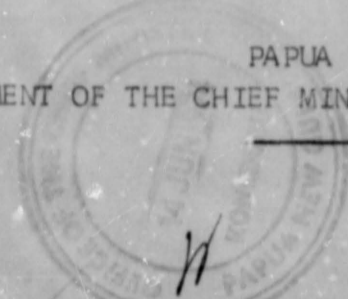

The predilection of the Local Govt. Engineering Dept. to design elaborate and expensive bridges for even small crossings of 40 ft, such as the Upper Yaganon, is a continuing source of amazement. The justification is apparently that as R.I.P. money is available for such projects, then it should be utilised. However it ignores the principle behind the Govt's 8 point programme in that expensive bridges are not necessarily more economical than well constructed ones using maximum of local materials. In addition of course there is more revenue available for other projects.

Development of the Yaganon appears assured, although it will be a long term process.

Your comments deal with the other aspects mentioned.





PATROL REPORT NO. 26 OF 1973/74 - SAIDOR

Attached please find the above patrol report which was duly mounted into the Yaganon Census Division by A.P.O. Mr. Banzak. The purpose of this patrol was to organize a contract carpenter, Mandara, in order to commence work at Ganglau aid post with a medical store complex. However, Mr. Banzak also inspected the Iantub/Yalau Road and gave talks on the political development whenever there were queries raised by the people.

My comments on the report are as follows:-

R.I.P. Projects.

The people of Ward 29 inspite of requesting the aid post to be constructed at Ganglau, have been long known for their unco-operation towards the Rai Coast Local Government Council R.I.P. projects. This attitude is now changing in the areas where the people of the Census Division have a great demand for the Council projects. For example my last observations in the area has shown that since the people have long desired the road link from Saidor administrative centre into the area, they have assumed a keen interest and done quite good work on this project.

Political.

The problem with the councillors mentioned in this report is real and one that cannot be easily solved because most councillors are residing on the coast away from their ward members. Incorporated with this problem is also that the councillors in this C/D sometimes neglect their wards so long that some important issues raised in the Council sittings are not discussed with their constituents. Subsequently, what is really lacking is planning on the councillors' part to pay more visits to their ward members and try to motivate them in the Council's activities.

In addition, some councillors, like the Council president, who is from the C/D, have now committed themselves in the business arena might not possibly eschew their economic opportunities so that they would visit their wards. I feel that unless there are accessible vehicular road links to the inland villages, which the coastal resident councillors represent, the problem of communication will remain for a long time as yet.

Furthermore the issue raised about Hon. Mr. John Poe M.H.A. (Rai Coast Open) had been discussed with Lim and he has intended to visit some of the coastal villages once he has a chance in the near future using either the Government speed boat, or the Administration vehicles. It is of great concern to note that often Ministers, such as Hon. Mr. Poe, who are busy with their ministerial duties, have to be blamed for not attending to their electorates. The odds are that either the House of Assembly ministerial members attend to all the villages in their electorate and achieve very little, or attend to the administrative duties of their portfolios for the benefit of the people at the national level.

Economic.

The growth in economic activities is becoming more apparent in the Yaganon Census Division. There are nineteen (19) proposed cattle projects which have now been approved for the people, and with the copra and coffee, as the other major cash crops, they should provide enough day to day work for a large portion of people of the area.

Social.

I have nothing to comment on this aspect as nothing of importance was raised in this report.

In conclusion, my overall comment on this Officer is that Mr. Banzak was told, by Mr. Creagh (D/O), to re-write the report and at one stage too Mr. Creagh spent sometime assisting the reporter in re-compiling it. In future, young Officers, like Banzak, should take greater care when compiling reports of this nature.

PATROL NO.26 YAGANON CENSUS DIVISION:Special Patrol - R.I.P. Projects:Introduction:-

This patrol was conducted mainly on R.I.P. projects. Particularly on construction of Aid-post building at Ganglau. This patrol also touched briefly on Road inspection, social, economy and Political aspects.

R.I.P. Projects:

The sand and stones for the foundations of the Aid-Post were gathered by the Ganglau people. The Mindiri, Kubuk, and Kulilau people did not come so I went to the villages and asked them to come and work for only two days. The construction of the Aid-Post then commenced there after and now the work is successfully underway.

ROAD:

This patrol also inspected the Road from the Yaganon River to the Gawar River. The bush has already been cleared and I was told that the work would commence on the road as from the 6th of May, 1974. On other side of Yalau Plantation, people from Simididi, Diman, and Dumun had started working on the from 29th of April, 1974.

Political:(a) LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCIL:

As this patrol resided in the area, we were told by the people that ~~EM~~ the councillors are all good councillors. However, this patrol team had an impression that they are not. To support the above, here is an example. When we sent for the people to come and work on the Aid-Post none of them turned up, even though I had asked the councillors to arrange for people to work. The councillors had failed to tell the people. The only councillor who was always available was Ipang from Orinma, whose house is about  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile from the Aid-Post.

The President of the Rai Coast Council is residing right in the village but he did not make any attempt to come and inspect the Council Project and see how it was coming along.

House of Assembly:~~XXXXXXXX~~

People in the area were asked by this patrol team about the House of Assembly. And they said that they heard of what is going on everyday in the House of Assembly, but do not fully understand all of what is going on. I took time out to answer some of their questions and they seemed to be very happy.

House Of Assembly Member:

People in the area said that they are happy about their Member as recently the Member often talked for his Electorate, but they were also concerned that whether he will make any arrangement to see the people and give them some talks on the economy. I told the people that I would mention their worries to the M.H.A. Mr. J. Poe.

Political Education:

I conducted talks on the subject and most people did not bother to raise questions. When I mentioned Independence, many of them reacted wildly and said that they did not want to hear about independence too, soon. Independence date was the main concern of the people in the area. I explained that no date had been set for Independence by the House of Assembly. I gave talks on Independence and what it meant.

(b) Economic:

Cattle projects have been recently started by the local people and it shows a great interest of the people that they are eager to work hard. Copra and Coffee are among the main products of the area.

~~(c) Social:~~ Village cash crop is very limited due to transport difficulties and local markets. The only Transportation source in the area by sea routes. There is only one Non-indigenous plantation owned by Mr. & Mrs. Snook.

Education: All the children from the area are attending the Meibu and Lamtub Primary Schools.

Health: People in the area were healthy when this patrol team was there. The villages were tidy, as well.

Mission: Lutheran Mission is the only mission that exists in the area visited.

Law & Order:
