



UPDATE ON THE FRIEDA DAUM UREY FELLOWSHIP

As many of you already know, the Frieda Urey Fellowship is given to a woman who has had a significant hiatus in her studies and then enrolls as a graduate student at UCSD. The recipients have been impressive women, and it has been very gratifying to read the short biographies they have written for Bear Facts and to meet them at our Spring Luncheons. It is nice to know that the financial aid of the Fellowship has made it a little easier for them to achieve their goals. The Fellowship Fund has grown thanks to the family and friends of Frieda who have made generous donations. This past year, Clara and Fred Wall donated appreciated stock, and a few years earlier, Mary Lorey (Frieda's daughter) made a sizable donation to the Fund. As a result future stipends will be increased.

Last year's Fellowship recipient Sandra Logan received her Ph.D. in Literature on August 28th, 2000. Her thesis topic was "Willing Subjects: Historical Events as Rhetorical Occasions in Early Modern England", and her thesis advisor was Dr, Louis Montrose.

Barbara Starkey attended the thesis defense, and she reported that the work received high praise. We were very happy that we could offer the Oceanid Pavilion as a place on campus where a Ph.D. party could be held, and it turned out to be a great party,

with wonderful food (catered by Sandra and her mother), and people sitting around talking way past 10pm. As one Oceanid commented: "Frieda would have gotten great pleasure in knowing that the Pavilion was used in this way."
