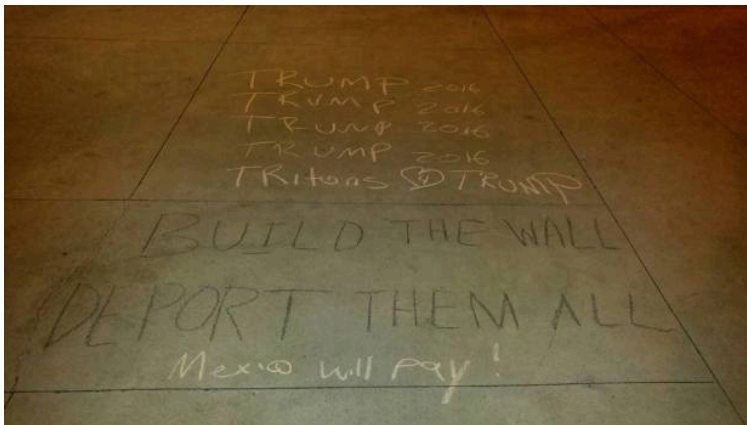


## Simple experience in UCSD
