HEALTH FAIRE

In recent years health has become one of the premier issues in this country. There is a growing emphasis on both health care and exercise. More and more people are beginning to realize how important it is to take care of themselves and their bodies. Yet there are still many who are unaware of the importance of the issues of health in general and of their own physical and mental health. In an effort to promote general health the Student Health Center, in cooperation with several other organizations, is holding the 2nd annual Student Health Fair from 11-12 on Wednesday, February 18, at the Revelle Plaza.

The structure of the fair is simple. In the middle of the plaza tables will be set up in a horseshoe shape. The two end tables will act as check-in posts. At one of these a person will receive a checklist. With the checklist in hand, a person should then go and visit the other tables.

The tables themselves have been sectioned off into blocks. Each block has its own area of concentration and is designed to provide specific information and individual evaluations. There will be a number of different blocks on a variety of different topics. The lifestyle block will contain information on sex, substance abuse, eating disorders and stress. The physical health blocks will

Christopher Huffman provide information on such subjects as immunization, Tay Sachs disease, anemia and the prevention of birth defects. At each stop along the way one can receive evaluations which can be analyzed at a "fit stop".

This fair may seem like an idea contrived in order to make people into health crazed exercise nuts. However, it is actually a good practical opportunity. This fair will allow one to assess their present physical state. It will also allow people to ask the questions that have not been asked because they didn't know who to ask. The Health Fair is a well-organized event that can only benefit those who use it.

Knowing something about birth control can be useful knowledge whether it be for oneself or for a friend. When choosing a method of birth control, one should consider the safety, effectiveness, and convenience of the method. Birth control methods can be divided into two groups: Prescription methods which require a visit to a medical doctor, and non-prescription methods which can be bought over-the-counter. The United States has one of the highest rates of teenage pregnancy in the world. Much of this is attributed to the lack of using birth control or its incorrect usage.

The best way to learn about birth control is through Planned Parenthood or the Birth Control Information Sessions at the Student Health Services. The sessions are held in the upstairs lounge Mondays 2-3 p.m., Tuesdays 12-1 p.m., and Wednesdays 12-1 p.m.. For further information call 534-2669.

ACCENT ON ACADEMICS

DECLARE YOURSELF!

If your transcript still reflects an "Undeclared Status" you may face unnecessary delays in enrollment for future classes. You need to declare a major course of study as soon as possible, especially if you have junior or senior status. We encourage you to make an appointment with an academic counselor to help you in your decision making process. Also, you may be interested in a Career Services workshop entitled "Identifying your career". This is an all-day workshop to identify viable career options through extensive self-assessment. Check with Career Services for dates of the next workshops.

THE "W" GRADE:

A student may drop a course before the end of the ninth week of instruction by filing the appropriate form with the Registrar, after first notifying the instructor and/or department. If you drop a course after the end of the fourth week of instruction and before the end of the ninth week of instruction, the Registrar will assign a final grade of "W" for that course. You may not drop a course after the end of the ninth week of instruction (March 6, 1987). When dropping a course, keep in mind the minimum progress requirement of 36.0 units each academic year.

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY EXAMINATIONS:

Language proficiency exams will be given in French, German, Spanish, and Russian on Saturday, March 14 at 9:00 a.m., in USB 2722. The written exam will be followed with oral interviews scheduled March 17 and 18, 1987. If you plan to take the exam, sign up at the Language Center Office, P&L 2125 during weeks 9 and 10 for BOTH the reading and oral portions of the Proficiency Examinations. Also, check with the Language Center staff for any restrictions and/or recommendations needed before signing up for the examinations.

Intern applications are now available in the Provost's Office for the following four Intern positions:

- Editor of **REVELLATIONS**: Organizes the staff, sets up meetings, budgeting, news collection, mailing of procedures, and publicity.
- Commuter Advisory: Works with the Commuter Advisory Board and the Adopt-a-Commuter program, and develops programs to help commuters stay involved in college events.
- Faculty/Student Programming: Helps bring programs to Revelle that stimulate interaction between students and staff, such as Firesides, and Faculty Talent Bank.
- Noon Programming and Social Events: Sets up events such as Casino Night, noon concerts, T.G.'s, and other Plaza and Commuter Lounge activities.

Besides these specific duties, each intern is also responsible for maintenance of the Commuter Lounge and working in the Lounge for 10 to 12 hours every week answering the phones and questions. Additionally, the interns are responsible for planning Welcome Week in the fall. Each Intern also assumes a secondary responsibility for one of the following: Publicity Resources, Commuter Lounge Facility, Student Involvement Opportunities, or Student Government Information. More information on each of these position's responsibilities is available in the application itself.

Some of the qualities the Interns must have is an honest interest, energy, enthusiasm, and developed leadership skills. The applications are due April 17th by 4:00 p.m. but don't wait until it's too late! Apply NOW!!
