## NOTES ON THE WORKS ON TAPE

Analysis 78-3 was written for the 11th International Festival of Sound Poetry in Toronto.

Fonergon 78-2 was composed from the sounds of the name Frits Bruinsma.

Fonergon 79-5, subtitle: Otto the Rhino on the Fitti-Hooli-Islands in the Benga-Sea, was inspired by a children's book called Otto is a rhino by Ole Lund Kirkegaard. Further impulses came from observations / informations about real live rhinoceroses: the elegance of their slow movements, the speed they are able to develop (40 km/hour), their amazing love songs.

The works called Zwevingen were made originally as visual poems. Only after I finished a number of them, it occurred to me that they might be read aloud. They are concatenations of letters which overlap. The structure of the material I used resulted in a kind of moire effect that reminded me of the so-called "beats" known in music (beats occur when two pitches are very close to each other). The Dutch word "zwevingen" is used to describe this special timbre - but. more generally, the word means "floatings".
