

One of the nation's authorities on the making of wine will speak on the San Diego campus April 5 as an All-University Lecturer

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One of the nation's authorities on the making of wine will speak on the San Diego campus of the University of California Thursday afternoon, April 5, at 4:15 p.m.

Maynard A. Amerine, Professor of Enology at the University of California, Davis, will speak on "The Well-Tempered Wine-Bibber" at Sumner Auditorium. His will be one of the All-University Lectures. The talk is open to the public. Admission is free.

Well-known as the co-author of a standard work, "Table Wines," Amerine heads the Departments of Viticulture and Enology at Davis. Enology is the knowledge or study of wine. The department is pioneering the development of automatic grape harvesting.

Amerine's talk will deal with the psychology and aesthetics of food preferences.

Amerine's book on table wines won an award from the French government. "A good wine," he says, "must have a come-hither quality. In this respect, wine is like an attractive woman. It must have something to stimulate the imagination."
