

"God" to be presented

Woody Allen's farcical play, "God," will be presented in the John Muir Theatre at the University of California, San Diego at 8 p.m. Feb. 21-24 and Feb. 27 to March 1.

The theater is located in room 2250 of the Humanities and Social Sciences Building on Muir campus. Admission is 99 cents at the door.

In "God," Allen ponders the cosmic themes of God and death, though the seriousness of the themes is balanced by Allen's wit and sense of the absurd. The play within a play is a light burlesque which jumps back and forth between ancient Athens and modern Broadway as an actor and writer try to devise an ending to a play they will enter in the Athenian Drama Festival.

Jerry Schweibert, a master of fine arts candidate at UC San Diego, will direct the production. The John Muir Theatre is the UC San Diego Department of Drama's lean theater, with actors concentrating on realization of the text with a minimum amount of scenic and costume elements.
