

9 members Physics Department to attend APS meeting

Nine members of the University of California, San Diego, Physics Department are attending the 1964 Spring Meeting of the American Physical Society, which started on Monday, April 27, and lasts through Thursday, April 30, in Washington, D. C.

In addition, eight members of the UCSD Physics Department have written or contributed to papers which will be read at the meeting.

More than 800 scientific papers will be presented in 75 sessions during the four-day meeting. As many as nine sessions will be held concurrently in the various meeting rooms and auditoriums reserved for the meeting. Topics of the papers will range from astrophysics, cosmic rays, and photonuclear reactions to nuclear, theoretical, and general physics.

R. F. Hornig, newly appointed science adviser to the President of the United States, will speak at the main banquet of the society meeting to be held Wednesday evening.
