In November last year contact was made by myself with a number of people from You (see seport 50.3, 172/73 of a coul). Nowever, more recent information pathered both by the petrols of 3. VICIM. Edical assistant (barch, 1973) and 3. 6. 5. 5. 7. Eatrol officer (asy, 1773, seport 80. 7) revealed that the You people sere no longer living within the bounds of the chimbu sistrict. From discussions held with a number of sen from Yale and find it would appear that the Yous have resettled near the headwaters of the Tyani (Yani) siver, probably within the SLI 1/2 of the latest set introduced as a least too full days salk cast from Tale/

The patrol see also told that the present fou village contained mix family houses plus one single sens touse. From this information I would estimate a total population of approximately forty to lity eroons.


(d) & (e) As described in B. MOVIETION DISTRIBUTION AND TRIBD, the area now consists of three distinct socio-geographic groupings:

at 100 Village, now believed situated within the GINI C/D of the GRAPA oub district, the original fultul is believed to have died some years ago. The group is new led by an ex - "reliceren", ID, who claims that the Covernment has forcetten his people, yet at the same time he is making it extremely difficult for patrols to track him down.

H. Missions

- (a) After a preliminary patrol through the area in May this year the New Prices Mission has recently established a base at mia village. This being the first and only mission to have operated within the U/Ds has meant that, due to the isolation of the area, no friction exists with other missions.
- (b) The mission consists solely of an inglish family Mr and Mrs J. DOUGLAS and their two children: a boy aged five years and a girl aged two years.

A bish materials house has been built, with the consent of the owners, on native land within the village land. The mission is a light with an second radio containing the following frequency crystals:

A sonin 1-1500 generator is classeved to recharge radio batteries and will eventually power bousehold in https: etc.

ha jet the mission provides no services and le secordance with h.T.A. practice, the initial work of the missionary is to learn the local language and to pather information on the traditional culture. Public religious services are at vet being conducted. The mission also has no plans to set up a managere.

However, one corvive which could be offered by the mission is that of an hid rost. Ers Johns is both a "state existered flurge" and a "state Sertified Midwife", (U. .) and is resistered as a flurge in Fig (Sert. No. 12405). Provided that P. 1. 1. is able to provide her with medical supplies, are bounded in willing to open an Aid Fost. The local people are also quite prepared to creet the required building for use as an Aid Fost. In his report of April this year, I believe that her D. Viscilla Ledical Assistant of P. M.D. has already put forward a case to justify the establishment of an Aid Post in the area.


The mission is currently supplied by a self-appler chartered from the S.I.L. Base near sorcha. But as thes method of supply is extremely expensive the mission is considering electing a light aircraft strip running south from mais. The construction of such a strip is feasable but would require the efforts of every able bodied can in them vicinity for quite a few months. Even then such astrip would require constant maintenance by the people. A proper drainage system rould have to be implemented if the strip is to be prevented from becoming waterloged during the wet season.

(c) The local people's reaction to the mission has been friendly and helpful and I do not forsee any problems at this stage. However, word of impending airstrip construction has already spread far and wide. This could result in the people's material expectations being built up to the point where future disappointment and frustration would be inevitable. Cargo cult overtones could also become associated with the mission's activities, especially if an airstrip is constructed. Fortunately if DOUCHAS seems aware of the possible impact he could have on the culture of the people and maintains that he will try to prevent the above complications from arising - but much is the price of progress.

All villages have cleared beli-rols and for a number of years the government has co-ordinatedhelicapter charter times to fit in with patrol and election schedules. L. STAGE OF POLITICAL DV LOS HIZ

A number of beopie and heard of self overmment from retained t.b.s. workers. Although the term means practically nothing to them some people expressed the fear that they would be forgotten after self covernment. In raply I outlined, as simply as possible, what self overnment was and explained that soverment patrols would continue to visit the area doing such the same things would continue to visit the area doing such the same things that had been done before. By explanations were readily accepted and were all that was needed to allay any fears that the people and were all that was needed to allay any fears that the people might have had at this stage. On a more energl level though, mutical political issues have no relevance to these people at their present level of development. (a) Mational Bovel

(b) Local Level

In the case of local political awareness too only significant factor evident was that the people were quite relieved that they were not included in the Borai - Mikaru L.C.C. The people may eventually become more favourably disposed towards joining the Borail but such a change will only evolve gradually and should not be forced.

M. ESOHOMY OF THE ARCA

Although there has been no significant change in the past year, a number of people expressed the belief that the Bomai - Wikary 1.0.2. aight try to pass rules limiting the price of bush products (live birds, animals, plummage, skins etc) offered for sale by the Pio/Turas. But as the Pio/Tura is outside the above Council's area I do not believe that it would have the power to inhibit this free trade. In any case the Bomai - Mikaru 1.0.0. should be discourage? from thinking along these lines.

The patrol was mounted primarily to publicise to the people about the coming of a group of surveyors. The surveyors were hired by the Papua New Guinea government to carry out the initial survey of the proposed re-routing of Chuave/Kundiawa section of the highlands highway. The task was to gather village elders, land owners and councillors to discuss the importance of the surveyors' work and also to tell the people about the intention of the government's plan.

The publication was well received by the people of sinasina and part of Kundiawa area. Although in various parts of the area, some village elders express grave concern about the surveyors going through their traditional village. However, this had been settled after explaining the importance of the survey and the government's plan. The people were willing after all, after considering the conditional of the road at present. They also express concern that as the road at present was "like snake", many of their children plus older people could not know or see what was coming behind or infront and due to this many people got killed. Other problems or reasons would be discussed later.

As I have discussed earlier the reactions of the people was great in some parts of the area, in discussion. Many refused to let the surv yors through their village, but as I have said earlier after some moments of consideration from the people they later agreed to let the surveyors through. Although I would not really say that the surveyors would go through without encountering much trouble, In some parts they might encounter resistance from the people. However, I presumed, that is to say from my own judgement the surveyors will carry out the initial survey of the proposed re-routing of linasina/hundiawa section of the highlands highway without much resistance.

There are various problems encountered during the patrol. These are the problems the people express from village to village as the patrol went through. Although they were not real serious however, they are workt mentioning. The following are the list of problems encountered or likely to be encountered.

a. Price of Improvements (The people were not satisfied about the gov't's

set price on various improvements).
b.Traditional Village(The people did not like the idea of the surveyors surveying part of their village). c. Cemetry (same concern as traditional village).

d.Coffee(Only cash income-did not want it to be destroyed). e.Village slipping off once road made.

These are some of the problems the people express during the patrol. And due to these the surveyors might be stopped in certain areas.

Generally speaking as being typical Chimbus the people wanted more pay on coffee as this is the make most important and only cash income in the highlands area.

Due to high population density especially in the Sinasina area as land is very scaree the people express concern about the surveyors going through their villages. They also mentioned that once the road is made through in future, they were worried about the whole village giving away, as seen in some other villages in certain parts of the highlands highway. Thatix is to say the ground is slipping off and where there is a village, the village might slip off as the in the highlands is usually clay type and is not too strong to hold on.

These are the likely problems that might delay the surveyors' work.

The effects of the patrol was very successful in some parts of the area being patrolled. From my point of view I would assumed that the surveyors will do their work without much trouble.

In conclusion I would say that the people were very co-operative in dealing with the job itself. Through the help of the people the job was done without encountering much trouble. However, as typical of Chimbu people they might change their minds at any moment, once the surveyors reached their part of the land.
